ARTICLES-5 SWAMI OMKAR

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1. DIET

There is a common saying repeated that: If you tell me what kind of friends you have, Iwill be able to tell what you are. There is another similar thought, runs thus: If you tell mewhat kind of books you read, I will tell youwhat you are. Let us add to these another pertinents aying thus: If you tell me what you eat, I will be able to tell, what you are.

What an important part the question of foodplays, especially in the spiritual life, and in the control of the restless mind! And alas! How deplorably is the food question often entirely ignored, in the practical life of theworld!

Man has become a slave of his senses especially to the insatiable taste of the tongue. The greatprecept that: *Man shall not live by bread alonebut by every word of God*, should be changedaccording to the gross every day experience of theaverage person as follows: *man shall not live byevery word of God but by ordinary dailybread*.

This would be an apt axiom for the presentday people, especially to all those who are livingfrom day to day by making the stomach their God, with all kinds of excesses in tasty beverages and delicious dishes. It is strange that one is reallynever satisfied, whatever or however much he mayeat. As soon as his food is digested, he craves formore and more ceaselessly. "What shall I eatnext", is the never failing and perplexing question of the epicure.

Scriptures and sages have taught us that allfood comes under three divisions, the *Satwic,Rajasic* and *Tamasic* food. *Satwic* food such as fruitscreate harmony and equilibrium. Rajasic food such as milk, cooked vegetables, grain etc., creates activity and fervour. *Tamasic* food such as meat, fishand other stale, fermented and putrefied highlyseasoned articles, create instability, inertia andgreat delusion.

Hence by analysing the food that we are eating or partaking of everyday, we can well know, what we are. Are we *satwicas*, *rajasicas* or *tamasicas*? Does our temperament manifest harmony, activity, or darkness? Let us analyse according to the respective food that we have been addicted to.

Whatever kind of food one may eat, even if it is the most natural food, overeating is the most harmful and deadly enemy of spiritual life. If there is anything repulsive and pathetic, it is the great suffering of the man, who overeats beyond his capacity and suffers untold physical andmental agonies, how can such a man, concentrate or meditate on God?

It is sad to see that people are giving all their attention to *Aaanas* postures, and to the various ways, means or methods, of controlling the restless mind. Rather than giving even a little thought to the cause or source of all this restlessness. How long can we cover a putrefied boil or

wound with rose petals, neglecting the root or core of the boil? Letus begin our treatment not from the surface butfrom the very source.

The dangerous poison from the sting of ascorpion in the form of highly spiced unnatural foods is filtering into our very system, filling ourveins, and blood vessels with agony, restlessnessand suffering. Having the poison within, what is the use of cooling or fanning without? When themind is in a state of feverishness, what is the useof finding or knowing the direct methods of God realization?

The most helpful thing under such conditions would be a good purgative, followed by a natural diet, to make the unruly mind ruly, restful and poised.

To avoid becoming intoxicated after indulgingin strong drink is simply to refrain from drinking, not to waste precious time in trying vainly to find out the methods to control the tipsiness. Theeasier, direct and natural way, is just to give upforever intoxicating drinks of every kind. Ourefforts if any, should be directed towards the firmness of the foundations and not towards the structures that are all unstable without proper basis. Use right effort, to achieve right results.

There is one complaint and trouble among allthe seekers of Truth--that their minds are restlessand wandering. This complaint can be solved onlywhen the food question is solved. When manbegins to respect nature, and goes back to his natural diet, half the spiritual victory is won.

Whenever we eat, if we could only keep inmind the great truth, that we should *not live* onlyfor eating but eat only for living, what a greathelp it would be in avoiding all kinds of unnatural, stimulated, putrefied tamasic foods. How much more efficient we should be for the working out of oursalvation!

It has been said that one who has controlledhis tongue or taste, has controlled everything. One who has not controlled the very first and elementary step in the spiritual path, namely his taste, has controlled nothing at all, in spite of hisimagined deep and profound learning and fanciedwisdom.

Everyone should choose his ownspecial kind offood, considering his temperament and life. Thatwhich gives him strength and inspiration, shouldhe eaten in reverence and moderation. But nevershould one be a slave of eating every kind of unwholesome or tempting food at mere inclination, and then overeating as well.

Silently and steadily as man evolves, he goesfrom the most crude forms of food to the mostnatural and simple diet. He changes his *tamasic*diet into *rajasic* and *rajasic* diet into the light pure *satwic* diet. His mind also becomescorrespondingly pure restful and poised. It finally does not need any further strain of various practices to make it steady or one pointed. Nature attunes with nature.

If one wants to quell the bubbles on the surfaceof boiling water, the natural way is not to heat itwith more fuel, but to quench the fire and to allow the water to cool down. The water naturally coolsdown, and all the bubbles disappear automatically, with the removal of the irritating fire.

So let our first and foremost effort bedirected, not towards the curbing and controllingabstinence from the unnatural stimulants and food stuffs that are entering into our systems day and night.

Thus we can begin to enjoy the Kingdom ofPeace and control of mind right here and now inthe stillness of our purified hearts, through themedium of palate control, and all in a most natural and simple manner.

2.DETACHMENT

(How to detach yourself from the body)

The essence of all religions is contained in this vitaland deep idea of detachment from the body. One needs detachment not only from the physical bodybut also from the mental and causal bodies too. But alas, one can detach himself from anything and everything, but how very difficult it is to be detached from the physical, mental and causal bodies-*sthoola*, *sookshma* and *karanasareerams*? Whetherit is difficult or easy, Peace that passeth all understanding belongs only to those rare and blessed souls who candetach themselves from the above three bodies.

Often at the hour of dawn and dusk, I go towards Santi Plateau in Kailas to watch the rising sun from thehorizon on the vast ocean or setting sun behind the long ranges of hills. I usually sit on a small slab of stonewhile musing thus. The other day when I went thereto meditate, I was amused to find some being already meditating on my seat.

Who was it? It was a small snail with around shell body. I was glad that I did not sit on thestone without seeing the small snail, for I would havecrushed the poor thing. As soon as it saw me, itbegan to move slowly away stretching its little headforward.

But I said, "My friend, please do not be afraid ofme. I won't hurt you. Here, we have room for bothof us and we can both sit and meditate."

With such thoughts I sat beside it and began towatch its beautiful disc shaped shell. I was also interested to notice all the exquisite designs on its outstretched neck as the tiny creature was slowlycrawling away.

Who can engrave all these beautiful designs even on the neck of an insignificant snail except God, the Almighty! I lifted my eyes from the snail to the little flowers that decorated the bushes around. How sweetand fragrant all these flowers were each having its own beautiful design, colour, and fragrance! Who can make a flower except God!

How sad to find man, with all his intelligence using the God-given Powers to invent dreadful instruments of death and destruction such as Atom Bombs etc., todestroy the world and himself, instead of using hisdivine faculties in creating something useful, helpfuland concrete for the happiness of man and for the well-being of the world!

Here we are not concerned with the inventions of man and his mighty genius, its perverted use or proper use for the good of the world. Our present theme is only DETACHMENT from the body. As I saw the snail and its inseparable attachment or unitywith its shell, I began to realise how similarly man also is inseparably connected and attached to the shell of his body.

Can you separate the snail from its shell? Deathwill be the result of such separation. Same will bethe case, if we separate man from his body, at leastfor the average man. But there is a spiritual stateof detachment which makes man free and happy andthat can never hurt or destroy the body. We are concerned now more with that spiritual detachment.

I have on my table a sample of the smallest size cocoanut from our Totapalli gardens. It has been withme for some years. I keep it before me as it helps meas an object lesson of detachment. As I shake it, I canfeel the shell is separate from the kernel inside. Manthe aspiring man has to learn to be like this dry cocoanutseparate from the shell, for he is the *Chit*-Intelligencebut never the body of flesh, blood and bones.

In this connection I am reminded of a beautifulverse from Ashtavakra Gita that has been a sourceof joy and inspiration to me from my early days. May Ishare it with you, my loving readers? Here it is:-

If you detach yourself from the body andrest in INTELLIGENCE, you will at oncebe free, peaceful and free from bondage.

In some form or other, whether it is through therepetition of the name of God, of one's own favouritedeity, the *Ishtadaiva* or through *Yoga*, the control of the Mind stuff *ChittaVritties* or through *Jnana*, Wisdom, the discrimination of the real from the unrealall the votaries of every religion, all the seekers of Truth, have to come to this final state of detachment from body, to realize the goal of birth.

Identification with body results in inevitablepain, agony, misery, sickness, suffering and ignoranceof every kind resulting in destruction and death.

Identification with *Chit*, the intelligence naturally results in joy, contentment, health, happiness and Peace, finally leading to birthless and deathless stateof Supreme Silence.

Q: How to detach ourselves from the body is the important thing now to know. A:It can be done only through proper discrimination and introspection.

Please read the message once again on INTROSPECTION in the October issue of Peace magazine 1951, as ithelps you to detach yourself from the body and attachyourself to the Spirit, the Infinite Light.

To reach the Heights of Transcendental Glory, one must detach himself, not only from the threebodies but also rise above the five sheaths too, the *annamaya*, *pranamaya*, *manomaya*, *vijnanamaya* and *ananamayaKosas*.

Anna is food, the matter, *prana* is force, *manas* is the mind, *vijnana* is knowledge and *ananda* is bliss. The *Atman* is different from all these sheaths.

I love to close my message sharing with you afew more inspiring and helpful stanzas from the Sage Ashtawakraon the same theme.

Alas, as greed arises from the illusion of silver caused by the ignorance of mother of pearl, even so arises the attachment to the objects ofillusory perception from the ignorance of the Self.

Having known yourself to be that in which the Universe appears like waves on the sea, whydo you run about like a miserable being?

How wonderful! In me, the shoreless oceanthe waves of individual selves rise, strike each other, play for a time and disappear, each according, to is nature.

May the blessings of the sages and saints of Eastand West, the Beacon Lights of Guidance, the Ideal Gurus, be on the aspiring seekers of Peace to help themto be detached from the body, the seen, the visible andbe attached to the soul, the Unseen and the Invisible and thus bring Peace on Earth and Goodwill amongindividuals and nations is my earnest prayer!

followedthe patient. The District Medical Officer has been an old friend of the Ashram helping our cause ofpeace and service in all possible ways. But justthen, on that day he was very busy, hence he hasrequested our Manager to meet his Assistant, to getthe needful done, in admitting the patient in the Hospital.

Accordingly our Manager approached the Assistant, in all reverence and was telling about the case.But the all-important Assistant said to our Manager "DON'T BOTHER ME, now. "When our Manager tried to give him some Peace literature, to represent our peace cause to the poor and the sick, again the all-powerful Assistant said roughly, "Don't do any missionary work here!"

When I heard these hasty and thoughtlessremarks, it is needless to say, how sad the incident has made me. Since then, my mind has been seriously and sincerely thinking of all the tragediesenacted not only in the Hospitals, but in themany departments of service, even in the houses of God, namely: Ashrams and Temples. In the samehospital, another doctor made fun of the patient asthe case was serious. The patient was finally, admitted with the help of some other kind and loving souls in the hospital.

When our Manager went to the hospital tosee the progress of the Ashram patient after a fewdays, imagine the sad surprise, that the doctor whomade fun of our patient was no more. It seems hedied suddenly of heart attack. How frail is the finite life! How death comes to one and all and so unexpectedly even to doctors too. How true are thewords: *-Today is ours and nottomorrow!* Maythe Soul of the departed doctor rest in Peace – inGod, is our prayer!

Eyes have they, yet they see not, Earshave they, yet they hear not! We can stillhearken to the blessed words of Christ: Havingeyes, see ye not? God comes to us in so many formsto test our integrity and the so-called selflessservice. It was the blessed Christ who said:

"For I was hungered, and ye gave me no meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me no drink.Iwas a stranger, and ye took me not in: I was naked, and ye clothed me not: sick, and in prison, and ye visited me not.

As all are the images of God, especially the poor and the sick and the naked, blessed are theywho can see HIM, in all His various manifested forms! How true are the words, that in serving any of the least of His children we are only serving God and in ill-treating any of His children we are only ill-treating and neglecting the manifested images of God.

It is the simple Love ,the Love that expects notany reward or advertisement, the Love that excludesnone and includes all, that helps us, to realize the Goal of precious human birth. Sometimes it is helpful to recall the simple stories from *Puranas* and the old scriptures. It seems there used to be a *guru* and a *chela*, master and disciple. Both of them have been devoted and dedicated souls. The disciple begged his master to bless him with the Visionof God. He wanted actually to entertain God in his own house.

Out of compassion the Master, a great soul, said, that he will beg God, to visit the disciple's home, ona certain day, at a certain hour. Our disciple wasvery happy, with great joy at

this holy blessing andhe was getting ready to receive God with allhonours. The house was decorated and all kinds ofdainty and rich dishes were prepared and he waswaiting for God. Suddenly a dog appeared on thescene and it began to eat some of the dishes. Itwas rather too much for our disciple, so he took astick and beaten and chased it away. The *chela*waited until late in the night and God did not comeas he expected.

Later on, the *guru* came and the *chela* complained and the *guru* told him with a heavy heart:- "My poor, ignorant child, God came to you in theform of a DOG, but you chased Him away, beating Him mercilessly." The disciple was ashamed of hisdeep ignorance and felt remorse and repented. Since then, it seems he tried to see God even in thedumb animals and in all the creation on the earth. How true are the words, that: *He who loves Bird, Beast and Man is nearer to God!* And he alone truly loves God, in the highest sense. We oftensay, nay even take joy in repeating like parrots thateverything is God and God is everywhere and ineveryone and *All is Brahman*, etc.

But are we seeing God everywhere and in every one? Are we facing Him in all our tests, trials and tribulations! This is a question to be answered by every sincere devotee of God, from his own experience in the everyday life. Did you ever hear theinteresting story of the great miser *NavakotiNarayan*? It was amusing to hear it, when one of theSwamis in the Ashram was telling it to our *gurukula* children. There used to be a very, very richman, a big millionaire. He was called by the name*NavakotiNarayan* because he is the owner of 90Millions of Rupees or even more, but alas, he wasvery, very miserly. He would rather part with hislife itself, than with a little of his great wealth.

He was blessed with a devoted and God-fearingwife, who was always doing prayers, worship ofevery kind, and was doing charities too, to realizeGod. She wanted once a cocoanut, to offer to God, and she requested her husband to bring a cocoanutfrom the market. Our Narayan went to the marketand bargained to buy at every shop, the cocoanut at the lowest price. He wanted to know, whether hecould get a cocoanut still cheaper. He was directed to the cocoanut grove itself, where one can buy cocoanuts cheaper. There, he begged the owner of the garden to give him a cocoanut free. The owner out of pity told him, that he could climb the tree andtake one. Our Narayan was beside himself withjoy and he climbed the tree and took one cocoanut. He returned home to his wife with a happy andbeaming face, for he got the cocoanut free withoutspending even a few pies. The next day, was theday of Holy festival. His wife wanted to take abath in the Holy River Ganges. When devoteesbathe, the *Brahmin* helps them with *sankalpam*-repeating Holy *Mantrams*, then they have to pay *Dhakshina*- a gift of a few pies to the *Brahmin*.

Our Narayan was very much perturbed over it, but to satisfy his wife, he promised to take her on onecondition, and the condition was that she has to walklong distance, where it is not crowded. So, both ofthem walked to the farther end of river bank, a longdistance and Narayan made sure, that no *Brahmin* was present there to ask *Dakshina* from him. While they went into the river and were about tobathe, suddenly to the consternation of *Navakoti*Narayan, a *Brahmin* appeared and stretched hishand for *Dakshina*—the gift.

As Narayan could not help, he promised to give gift after he reached home. The Brahmin washappy and contented at the promise of Narayan andhe repeated the Holy *Mantrams*-

Slokaswhile they bathed. On the next day when the *Brahmin* went to the house of Navakoti Narayan, he wastold that he was sleeping. When he approachedon the following day, he was told that Narayan wassick. When the Brahmin went again for his *pisa*, hewas told that Navakoti Narayan was dead. Our Narayan thought, that by hearing that he was dead, the *Brahmin* will leave him and will not come to his house again, But the *Brahmin* was not an ordinary *Brahmin*, and he was not discouraged by the tactics of Navakoti Narayan. After hearing that the man was dead, the *Brahmin* began to make all arrangements for the funeral. The stretcher for taking thedead body to the burning *ghat* was brought and Navakoti Narayan was placed on it and peoplewere carrying him to the burning *ghat*.

Navakoti Narayan thought that the *Brahmin* will leave him before reaching the burning *ghat*. Hewas watching the proceedings of the ceremony pretending as if he was dead. When he was placed on the pier, Navakoti Narayan opened his eyes, tobe sure that the *Brahmin* was not there, imaginehis sad surprise when he saw the *Brahmin*, stretching his hand for his *pisa*. Our Narayan fell in aswoon. Such is the love of money, the thick *maya*or delusion that makes the worldly man, ready to die,to offer his life itself, than the money that can berusted or taken away by robbers or by Government.Man in deep ignorance is not satisfied by merelysaying:- **Don't Bother Me**, but goes so far as to userough words such as:- 'get out'. In his dealingwith his fellow men. Sometimes they are rougheven to their innocent children, when they come tothem endearingly, all because they were busy withtheir so-called urgent and important works.

In the story our Swamiji was narrating, it seemsthat God look pity on the great miser and blessed himwith His *Darsan*- with the vision of Himself. Dueto his good *Karma*, the miser in a flash realised, theglory of Service and the folly of hoarding andmiserliness. Since then NavakotiNarayana, madegood use of the God-given money in distributing allhis immense wealth, among the poor and the sickchildren of God. How true are the words: thatpoor and naked we came into the world and poor and naked we leave the world! Thus many rich people, Politicians, Doctors, Lawyers, and Businessmen evensome of the Swamis and the Yogis use the sorrowful words unknowingly. "**Don't Bother Me**:" intheir dealings, with their fellowmen- the livingmanifestations of God. It is high time to realize thatGod comes to us in so many forms, in the form ofthe poor, the sick, the needy, the oppressed and thedepressed. It is our privilege to serve Him in all His various manifestations, remembering always that in ill-treating anyone. We are only ill-treating God and in serving and loving any of the least of Hischildren, we are only serving and loving Him.

Instead of using the fateful words of: **Don'tBother Me**, in every field of life and in all thedepartments, man should learn to use the lovingwords of blessed Christ: COME UNTO ME. Letthe cruel words of Don't Bother Me, be replacedby the comforting words of Come unto me. *Isavasyamidamsarvam*. All this world in pervaded by ISWARA, the One Indivisible God. It isour privilege to see Him, to recognize Him, within, without, above, below and all around, in all theforms and names and in all the world. Glory beunto God in the Highest in the unmanifested, and Homage be unto Him, in the manifested world!

You may read as thousand books on Fear, dealing with the ways and means of controlling it. You may write a hundred messages giving all hints for rooting it out from the core of one's heart, but alas, fear is still there in some subtle form or other in every one to a certain degree.

Q: -Why is Fear so common throughout the life?

A: -Because of the latent desire—the attachment to the body and the interest in the world and in all its investments in the form of children, near and dear ones properties, houses and a thousand other things.

A wise and learned poet says: - All things in this world are fraught or filled with fear. No one is free from fear, except the man of renunciation-the one who is free from all desires.

It is fire of renunciation that burns away the seed of desires from the very core. Devoid of renunciation, be he a mighty powerful monarch or a great *sadhu* with vast learning, it does not make any difference, he is a slave of fear in some form or other.

Fear is a cruel, ruthless and relentless enemy of body, mind, heart and soul. In extreme cases of fear, the hair on the head turns gray overnight and some die of it, because of the sudden fright, agitation and excessive pumping or palpitation of the heart.

There are certain delicate and gentle seeds that do not sprout or germinate if roughly handled. Again there are very hard and tough seeds that even if you crush them under your feet, it is nothing for them. Theywill germinate and grow in any soil. The mind is such a thick-shelled seed. Its life or germination cannot be killed so easily except through, thorough baking in the ceaseless fire of the Sun of suns.

It is easy to say, 'BE FEARLESS,' like a lion; but man in his actions is like a mouse. The ceaseless flow of God-consciousness is the only unfailing panacea to the incurable or the chronic disease of the deep rooted fear. The moment one forgets the centre or shifts it from God-consciousness to body-consciousness, there is the fear pouncing on the poor, helpless man, taking hold of him, sucking his blood, thwarting his very life and making a wreck of his ideals and destroying him mercilessly.

Q: -What shall we do then?

A: -Let us hold on the Light that never goes out.

There is Light in every man, in all of us, in all of God's children in East and West all over the world, the Light that never goes out, the Light which is not only constant or perpetual but Self effulgent.

The worship or recognition of that Light gives one strength as he clings to that Light which is life, soul and goal of the very existence, and which will surely drive away all fear.

The seed of fear is not only in man but it is also in all creatures and animals too. The world is full of fear. The mouse is afraid of a cat and a cat is afraid of a dog and a dog is afraid of a wolf and a wolf of a cheeta or a tiger and the tiger of a man. The good man is afraid of a bad man and the bad man too is afraid in case his rowdyism gets frustrated. Thus, fear is present in all, from a crawling ant to an aspiring devotee.

Simple ordinary resolutions and mild operations will not kill, destroy and root out this most harmful and pernicious and blood sucking enemy, the FEAR, the foe of one's health, joy and Peace of all that is good in life.

If there is anything to be afraid of in the world, to bereally feared, we are to fear only the hydra headed merciless monster FEAR for it is more dangerous and harmful than the contagious blood sucking and deva-stating diseases like leprosy or T.B. The germ of leprosy or T.B, attacks only the body of flesh and blood; but the pernicious germ of fear attacks not only body but even mind, heart and soul and it destroys all life and vitalityand kills all joy and aspirations and deadens all enthusiasm and zeal.

Q:-What is the root cause of fear?

A: - It is only body-consciousness, attachment to name and form.

Q: -Where is the remedy?

A: -The infallible remedy is only God-consciousness.

The presence of the Light alone dispels all clouds of darkness. There is no other way. So let the imaginary germ of fear be fried alive in the burning, fire of the millions of Suns' splendour.

There was no water in the tank as the labourers closed the mouth of the canal which leads water into it. Otherwise the tank would have been full and the work would have stopped. I was glad that the Ashramites and the labourers acted so intelligently. I sat on a bench on the tank bund alone and began to enjoy nature's beauty with an engrossed mind. The earth was cooled by the rain. The big trees and other small plants drank water to their satisfaction and were moving their boughs with delight.

At that sacred quiet time, one of the frogs in the tank began to pray. Another frog joined in the prayer. Some other frogs also joined in chorus with the above frogs. Then all the frogs in the tank and in all the surrounding places began to take part in the prayer, as if they thought: "When so many others are praying whyshould we keep quiet?" Iwas sitting there beside myselfseeing and hearing all this. A voice from inside seemed to be addressing me:

"O Man! When frogs are praying why don't you pray?" So I too began my prayer along with them, I did not pray with my mouth making the croaking sound of a frog. With the feeling of 'Soham' making every breatha flower, I began to offer it to God.

A thought arose in my mind: Does the Lord listen to the prayers of the frogs? When He listens to the prayers of human beings, why does he not hear the prayers of frogs? I thought and decided that the Lord who is all-compassion to all beings and who is the innermost Self of all, listens to the prayers not only of human beings but also to the prayers of every living being and especially listens first to the desireless prayers and is pleased with such prayers whether they come from human beings or from frogs.

17. FAULTLESS FRIEND

There is a writing in the Ashram, stating an ideal, that if you try to find a faultless friend in this world, you will have to quit the world even without a single friend, meaning, that there cannot be a man without any fault. God has not created man only with faults or completely devoid of faults. He has not created anybody with cent per cent good and any other body with cent per cent bad. Wherever there is evil there is also good and vice versa.

However bad a man may be, if we examine him carefully, there will be at least one good quality in him. So also however good a man may be, on careful examination, he will be found to be a slave to some small defect. Whether in good people or bad people, we have to take only what is good and helpful to us and leave the rest. Even in Dharmaraja, who was considered to be an embodiment of truth and righteousness, there was some weakness, his love of dice or some other thing. Similarly we can find some good quality even in people like Ravana and Duryodhana, who are held to be embodiments of evil and unadulterated heaps of bad qualities.

But, generally, in this world of ours, people, instead of trying to find good in others, give importance only to their defects. If we begin to find the faults in our friends, and go on leaving them oneafter another, we cannot have even one friend who has no blemish. So, it has been said that a person who endeavors to find a faultless friend will have to close his life without being able to find even one such.

Another Truth is, we find in others only what we have in us. If there is light in us, we see light in all. If there is darkness in us, we find the whole world dark.

At times, the whole world looks so sweet and Godlike. For that, the reason is the mental state. At other times, in difficult test and trials, the same world appears to be cruel, full of *satanic*qualities. For that also, the reason is the mental state. What we experience inside, also

materialises outside. Let us try to understand this problem clearly, by taking some common illustrations from our daily lives.

A person may be completely service minded and he may be rendering selfless service day and night. But he may be a slave to some bad habit like snuff or tea. Another may be serving humanity unintermittently, but he may be addicted to excessive talking or eating. A third may be carrying all our behests with great obedience and faith but he may be addicted to smoking or opium. A fourth may be engaged in service day and night but he may look down upon others with contempt. Some others may be endowed with several good qualities but the ego may be prominent in them and they may want to boss over others. Some may serve othersaccording to their ability but they may be full of selfishness, devoid of love, always craving for their own progress, welfare and liberation. We can take any number of such examples from human lives and scrutinize them. It is not for us to have an eye only to the petty habits and weaknesses of others and not to recognise the good in them, and look down upon them with contempt and take them to be good for nothing. Everyone acts according to his capacity. One may not be able to do the work done by another. Simply because you are not able to do the work I have done, I should not think that you are not fit for anything in this world.

Have you ever heard the story of the quarrel between the mountain and the squirrel? Listen to the story, originally written in beautiful verse.

'Once there was a quarrel between a big mountain and a small squirrel. The mountain called the squirrel."A small, insignificant creature!' The squirrel replied, "True. You are an extremely big thing. But see the progress of a big year! How manymoments, days and months make one year? So, oh mountain. I am not ashamed of my condition. I amnot as big as you and you are not as small as I am. Are you as nimble as I am? Capacities may differbut each is great in its own place. God has madethis arrangement with His unbounded intelligence with any fault, I may not be able to carry forests on my back as you are able to do, but can you crack hard nuts with your teeth as I do?"

Just as the tiny squirrel cannot carry big forestson its back like the big mountain, so also the bigmountain cannot crack nuts and fruits and eat themlike the squirrel. Everybody has wealth in the workthat he can do. If we recognise only the good inothers, and on the strength of that good we makefriends with them, all in this world will be ourfriends. We should keep our eyes always wideopen, only to see good in others. Till we realise thegood, the *sat*, that is, the Divine who is eternal andperfect, it is better to keep our eyes closed.

All is *Brahman*! The whole world is pervaded by Ram! As there is no place not even of the point of a needle, where God does not exist, we shouldnever anywhere in anybody see anything other than God. The lives of those who see forms of the Divine everywhere and treat everything as Divineand live with universal love, are indeed blessed! Separatist attitude turns blood into poison and causes disease. Equal vision and love fill us with newvigour and give us health and strength.

You might have heard this story. Once Yudhishthira and Duryodhana were commissioned to find outif there were any bad people in the world. Theformer, after traversing the whole world, came backand said that he could not find even one bad fellow! But

Duryodhana's account was that there was noteven one good fellow on the face of earth! Eachdecided according to his own mentality. The *shastras* say that knowledge of one's self is the greatestsecret. One who realises his own self, sees his ownself in the whole world and is immersed in bliss. How can one, who does not know himself, knowothers? Such a one always finds faults in others. Hedoes not see any good in any one. To him all areenemies and he cannot get a friend anywhere. Suchlowly lives deserve to be pitied, and they are a burdento mother earth. The lives of those who realise theirselves and attain the supreme goal of existence andawaken the souls in others, indeed serve as ideals andexamples to the country and entire humanity.

Such great souls realise the Divine in themselves and recognise the Divine in others and treat the whole creation as the form of *Sat-Chit-Ananda* and attain liberation, not elsewhere and elsewhere, but here and now. They are the liberated in life. They are treated as the friends of all. It was the Blessed Christ who said:
MAN SHALL NOT LIVE BY BREAD ALONE BUT BY THE SPIRIT OF GOD.

My present theme represents the above holy words of Lord Christ. Today I am happy and it is apt to write a message like this, on *Ekadasi* day, while fasting. How to make a Fast into a Feast? How to draw the subtle forces or divine energy from the silent fast?

This is the most important thing to be known, Heavenly *Manna* is what is needed. Heavenly *Manna* is no other than the nectar of Immortality, which is man's real birthright.

Theory is one thing and practice is another thing. There is as much difference as between heaven or sky and light and darkness, between them. It is not enough to repeat that one can Feast through Fasting. But one must actually fast, and meditate to get the benefits of feasting; tasting the heavenly *manna* in the stillness of his own purified heart of Silence.

In Santi Ashram, the Mother Institution, we have an apiary of bee boxes for taking honey. I was sitting outside under the cool shade of a mangotree while our school master Sarvayya was taking honey from the bee combs. He was showing to me one of the combs, and how ingeniously and arduously the bees were gathering honey. But also, to give their selfless labours only for the ignorant man, to the selfish man who lives on the toils of others, the industrious bees.

I felt the presence of God in seeing the honey combs.By reading about bee keeping one cannot actually understand the silent work and industry of the bees. Thus in little things and in big things, practice, personal experience, is most essential whether it is in bee keeping or in meditation.

Now coming back to Fasting, there is always the undigested food in a subtle form in the system of everyone, It is only through Fasting that all the foreign matter can be eliminated and burnt up, with a long fast. Then the mortal man becomes like a baby with a pure system. Enema also helps a great deal along with fasting and with sun baths and cold water baths.

Now the question is how to draw from the fast the subtle and spiritual forces and make it a real Feast? Deep meditation is most essential. As you meditate, follow your own breath ceaselessly, for, it leads you to Universal Breath; the one Indivisible Source of Divine Energy. May every breath *Soham*, lead you from the finite to the Infinite, from the physical to the Spiritual, frombody consciousness to God Consciousness, in a slow silent and steady way! Here practice, constant practice, ceaseless practice alone helps us, not the theory of listening to

discussions on and reading innumerable books on the subject of Fasting, Breath, and Breath Control.

Verily, we are *Soham*, the holy string of life eternal, passing through all forms and names in the universe covering mineral, vegetable, animal, and human kingdoms of life. Peace that passeth all understanding belongs to the one who can see the ONE in the many; to those rare and precious souls who are dead to the world of fame and name, and who are drawing inspiration from silence centering in the stillness of their purified hearts; and not to the slaves of the senses and palate, confined in the cage of blood and flesh.

Are you the body, the outer bead, or the soul, the inner string; the life-breath that unites all even the fragrant flowers on earth and the twinkling stars in the sky! Verily, *Soham*is Eternal Life.Forgetfulness of *Soham*, the Universal Energy,is death. May the Adorable Presence, the Self-effulgent Light, the Splendour of millions of suns, the sustenance of all creation, sustain us with Hisever-present invisible and interpenetrating energy, both in the Fasting and in the Feasting Days.

Awareness of His Presence, with each and every breath is the heart and soul of the spiritual Feast.

I felt as if my head was going to break into pieces. Someone asked me not to tell anything about my headache or pain to any of my pupils. Such is the atmosphere of America. But I took the earliest opportunity of telling about it to one and all that came in contact with me, for I am not afraid that my saintliness will be taken away because of this headache. Not only one headache, but even thousands of such pains and even sufferings of the whole world cannot lessen the Great Glory of my Spirituality. Is spiritual life to be measured with the passing clouds of pains and sickness? As there are clouds in the sky, there may be pains in the world. What is that to me? The Great Spirit in the Self of Selves, no headache or sickness can dare to nearit. The real Self is never affected by any of these little pains. It is above all changes of the dual life.

Even my recent severe headache could not have come without some cause, What can be the cause? There is no need of hiding it. The cause is with me! So if everyone examines carefully, the cause of their present sufferings and pains, they will not fail to find the cause of the same underlying their own life. Iwould like to tell something more about my headache although I dislike to speak of the personal things, still it is only when we tell others of our personal experiences, that they too in their own lives, will not fail to examine the cause of their own sickness or pains. What is the use of writing on impractical subjects? Theoretical life is not needed. There is enough of theory in the world nobody has any right to speak on pain when he has not known what that pain is. In the same way when one has not known what joy is, he is not expected to speak on joys of right living. Is it not a mockery for one to try to speak or write of cosmic consciousness without knowing what it is. Such talks and writings are useless and more waste of time.

I have the great joy to tell my loving readers that this essay was almost written mentally when I was in the firm grip of unbearable pains. The whole night, though suffering from pain, I was busily engaged in analyzing and diagnosing my subject. As soon as it dawned I took down all the hints on a paper, thoughstill in pain. Even as I am writing this essay now, am going back to that terrible night of suffering, for a subject on pain is to be written only from pain consciousness. A subject on joy or ecstasy is to be written only from the state of ecstasy, by one who is filled with the same. Then alone can a subject be practical.

Now let me write the cause of my recent sicknessor severe pain. The cause is simple, it is overstraining myself, overwork and over exertion of the physical body and mind. The cause is not outside. Am I to quarrel like a child with the outside surroundings or even with my headache? Neither am I to find fault with God. Am I to say, "O God I have been so spiritual, why do you send me sickness, why do you make me suffer pain, especially when I am engaged in your own work of serving the devoted souls." It is nothing but childishness and ignorance to find fault or blame God forthese momentary ills or pains of life that come on us as the most natural consequence of our doings in the world.

Dear Blessed Readers, you are to believe me if I say, not even once even in my hearts, did I wish ordesire for the disappearance of the pain in spite of itsterrible intensity. Why should I waste my precious energy even in that single desire on a momentary thing? When its work is finished, as it came it will go away. My onlywish has been to merge in that great consciousness, to live in that Great Spirit, which is inseparably one with me. I could not live away from it. I could live even with a hundred headaches and other pains, but never can I live without my Divine Birthright the Great Truth. By Realizing the Truth alone all will be well. Even without desire on our partwe will be free from every kind of pain. But we should try to be desireless, that too not without the desire of getting rid of pain. If not there is a desire in our very desirelessness. Our only desire need be to live in Spirit as Spirit, for we are Spirit alone. Indeed by knowing Truth alone we will be made free. Know the Truth and the Truth will make you free." What is this Truth? It is not possessing wealth or health. It is living in God-Consciousness. It is identifying ourselves with the Spirit.

Ofall the Divine Songs that were sung or givenout to humanity, by prophets and saviours, the SongCelestial occupies the most unique and unparalleledplace in the spiritual life of the world.

It is a Song that contains Philosophy, Yoga, Religion, Science, Politics and everything. It hasbeen repeated by great scholars and men of learningthat Gita contains the essence of the whole of Hinduism, nay the essence of all the religions in the World.

When I think of Gita, I am always reminded of the simple and instructive words of Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, that if one repeats again and again eventhe very name *Gita*, he too will be rewarded in some way, to a certain extent, for, by repeating the word *Gita*, *Gita*, one finds himself repeating *tyaga*, *tyaga* is Renunciation.

People are afraid of renunciation, both in East andWest, especially those who are attached to the goodsof the world. Yet, real happiness is only in renunciation and never in attachment, be it to anything.

When a young man approached Lord Christ, begging Him to show the path of salvation to enter into the Kingdom of Heaven. He said, "Go andsell all that thou hast and give to the poorand come and follow me." But the young man was afraid of renunciation, for, he had much wealth and riches.

Gita does not emphasise the outer renunciation, but it teaches to relinquish the desire and the fruits of one's acts. It teaches activity, but not laziness. It glorifies the blessedness of work done without attachment, to the fruits of the work.

Gita teaches the three-fold path of *Karma*-activity, *Bhakti*-devotion, and *Jnana*-wisdom.It is a most soul-awakening song, complete in itself.

It would not be an exaggeration to say that Gita, the Song Celestial, contains the spirit and essence of Christ's Sermon on the Mount, Buddha's Eight-fold Path, Mohammed's self-surrender and submission, Mahavir's piety and devotion, Nanak's strength and valour, and the wisdom of all sages and saints. I should like to say: What is there that Gita does not contain in itself or teach to the votaries of any religionor no religion! Gita is a Universal Song with a Universal Message appealing to all the Universal Hearts in all the Universe.

I have known people, personally, who can repeat the whole of Gita, all the eighteen chapters, frombeginning to end. What we need is not to memorise the Gita, but to practiceit's most ennobling and practical teachings in our daily life.

There are people who have read Gita not only hundreds of times, but thousands of times, and some of them are even far from selflessness or human love that makes a man universal, excluding none and including all.

In the name of religion and the study of Gita andthe universal teachings of sages and saints, it is sad to find yet the religious bigotry and fanaticism. Man still argues with the ignorant and egoistic thought, "My religion alone is the best."

One does not need to memorise the whole of Gita, to be liberated, to be universal, to be sweet and loving, to be selfless and human, but it is enough if one practices the teachings of a single chapter, or even a single stanza in the Immortal Song-the Gita, for, each and every word in all its verses is deep, divine and practical.

Gita is a Life-song, nay, it is a Soul-song! The story of Song Celestial is the story of one's own life. You can read it from the book, or you can hear it from outside. But, blessed is your life when you can listen it from inside, from the stillnessof your own purified heart.

In Gita the individual speaks about the Universal, glorifying the Life-Universal. Again the Universalspeaks and blesses the individual, glorifying the Peace of the individual, for, *It is the Individual Peacethat paves theway towards the Universal Peace*.

One can write volumes about the glory, beauty, originality, uniqueness, wisdom, immensity, universality, above all the practical utility and great significance of Gita-the Song Celestial, and I leave that to the eminent scholars and learned pandits who have made a life study of Gita. I am concerned here only with the sweet music of the Song of the Soul.

While returning from the West, my friends in Bombay took me to see the talking picture of Radha-Krishna. It was a sacred moment of ecstasy and inspiration, for, I was blessed for a moment, with Peace that passeth all understanding, by listening to the celestial music of Lord Krishna's flute.

Sri Krishna was playing, nay, He is still playing both within and without, drawing the world of men, as well as dumb animals towards Him. Everybody was rushing towards Him, and I too followed the crowd and was privileged to listen to the blessed notes of the celestial music of Gita-the Song Celestial.

It was so real and soul-awakening at the verythought of it, the memory comes back and I can stilllisten to the sweet and sacred music.

Sri Krishna was playing on His Divine Flute! A certain man of the world comes and snatches the flute from His hands and breaks it, still the same sweet, melodious music was coming out from the broken flute. The man getting exasperated andannoyed, begins to crush and pound the flute with a stone into small pieces, but the same celestial music was gushing out of the broken pieces of the flute.

24. GOD AND HOW TO WORSHIP HIM

This is such a vital and all important theme, followers of every religion long to know God and how to worship Him.Let us take an illustration understand this subject in an easy way. As anexample, there is our Kailas on the top of thehill. Kailas and how to reach it? Is there onlyone way to reach Kailas? No, there are severalways. It is wrong to say that there is only one way toreach Kailas. There is the high way, the road, onwhich one can come comfortably in a car. There is theway from the well, the beachside, where steps were made temporarily. Then, there is the ascent, thebeaten track made by the cattle that graze and village women, who go to gather the fuel. There is also another way through which now and then a daring soul cuts across and comes straight to Kailas, which is very hazardous.

Similarly, to worship God, there are severalways. It is wrong to say, "My way is the best andyour way is wrong." It is childish to say that one cancome to Kailas only by the road in a car or bus. Itis one of the ways to reach Kailas. But all cannot affordto come on cars. Neither can people take the steep hazardous path! According to the convenience, ability and strength, one selects his or her own pathand thus starts one the journey to Kailas. One more important thing before starting to reach Kailas, is tohow its situation, where it exists and the differentways or paths to reach it.

In the same way, before we worship God throughthe various ways, or one of the suitable ways, we mustknow where God is. A conception of God is mostessential, before we begin to worship Him, throughany path. Without knowing where Kailas is, whatis the use of knowing all the paths to reach it? Firstknow where Kailas is and then find out the various paths to reach it.

Similarly, first let us have a conception of Godand then find out and learn from the Holy Scripturesand from the Sages who have trodden in the Path ofTruth, the ways of reaching God. As one man'smedicine, may be poison to another, we have different medicines for people suffering from the samedisease. Thus, according to the temperament of theindividual and his conception of God, several modes ofworship have been laid out by sages in the scripturesof the East.

There are the four well known *yogas* or paths.

- 1. The KARMA YOGA—the Path of Action for the house-holders.
- 2. The *BHAKTI YOGA*—the Path of Devotion forthe devotees.
- 3. The *RAJA YOGA*—the Princely Path of Control of Mind.
- 4. The JNANA YOGA—the Path of Wisdomfor the men of Knowledge.

According to one's temperament and the mode of life in the world, one should choose his own path tofollow and thus worship God with all faith anddevotion.

My friend, what is your conception of God?Please tell me your conception of God, not from thebooks you have read or from the sermons or lecturesyou have attended. The real conception of God mustcome out, of your own personal experience.Do youstill feel that God is separate and aloof from you, andthat He is in some far-away heaven, or do you feelthat He is interpenetrating the very cells of your being?Those who consider that God is separate from them,

are busily engaged in worshipping God with flowersand fruits, through prayers and *Pujas*. Those whofeel that God is within them, in the sacred sanctuaryof their own purified hearts are worshipping Himthrough concentration and meditation.

Whether we worship God through rituals onmeditation, purity of heart is most essential, for it is the basis and foundation of spiritual life. In the worldof activity, Gita teaches to do duty for the sake ofduty, without expecting any reward.

BHAGAVAN SRI KRISHNA TAUGHT US:

He who offereth to Me with devotion a leaf, a flower, a fruit, water, that I accept from the striving self-offered as it with devotion.

LORD CHRIST TOO SAID:

For whosoever shall give you a cup ofwater to drink in my name, because yebelong to Christ, verily I say unto you, heshall not lose his reward.

This is salvation by acts through *nishkamakarma*. Salvation by Faith is through one-pointed devotion. Salvation by wisdom is through deepmeditation. Lord Christ worshipped God throughlove and service. Buddha worshipped God through nirvana, the annihilation of the self. Mohammedworshipped God through self-surrender. Krishnaworshipped God through Divine Wisdom. Whenonce we realize through wisdom, that God is Omnipresent, Omnipotent and Omniscient, we begin toworship Him, through all our thoughts, words anddeeds. Our very life is anoffering to God. As Sankara's sublime thoughts on Mental Worship arevery helpful, let me repeat them here:

MENTAL WORSHIP

O God, my body is Thy holy shrine
Thou art my Self-- the secret source of life,

If you are fond of *Jnana Yoga*, becentered in the Effulgent Light, believing in the inseparable and eternal identity of the Individual Soul withthe Universal Soul. These are the essential problems, in the life of every seeker of Truth, which he has to solve for himself sooner or later in his life, through introspection and intuition for the Peace of his soul.

Such is the thick*maya*, the dark delusion of outer life:

My heart longs to share with you only what I personally experience in my daily life, and not quotations from the Vedas and Bible, My Book of Personal Experience is my Veda. By His grace I was blessed with a Heart of Universality that lives and feels for all, excluding none but including all the children of God in all the world. Hence, in Waltair Ashram, in front of our Sushila *Mandir* of the late American Sister, I wanted to construct a TEMPLE OF ALL RELIGIONS with their respective libraries, and thus give a real temple of culture and education to all the seekers of Truth in the East and the West.

This lovely and inspiring place was blessed by the presence of the living saint, Sri *Pujya*Vinobaji, and he was kind enough to lay the foundation stone also. But the wise men of Visakhapatnam had only the outer vision of constructing bathrooms and latrines, instead of a Temple of Silence. Thus they wasted a great amount of money and constructed a big building for the use of the restless tourists. God though, in His infinite wisdomwashed away the costly building from its very foundations in the last cyclone. Now, some of these people, who think that they are all-knowing, with their finite vision, are planning to construct another building, within the Ashram itself, thus ruining my life's work and this makes my heart sad and heavy.

By God's blessings, with foresight and years of labour, to give a place of prayer and meditation to all the seekers of Peace in every religion, I created a Little Eden, a Garden of Peace by the side of the Ocean, with a Casurina Grove and a Cottage. But the wise men had taken it away in the name of "Public Good" and have now let fall into ruin the whole of the lovely Casurina Grove so that it now looks like the burial ground which adjoins it. And the lovely cottage of prayer and meditation has also disappeared. If you do not believe my words, please come and see it for yourselves especially the place where the two Palmyra trees stand, expressing their sympathy and sorrow.

May I share with you also my thoughts about the God-given, inspiring and Holy Kailas, onthe heights of a beautiful hill?

This was once a War-Base constructed by the Government during wartime at the cost of lakhs of rupees. After the war, when they were about to demolish the strong stone buildings the Vision came to me that what was once a War Base could become a Peace Base, radiating Love and Peace to all of India, and across the ocean, to all the world. Thus, six yearswere spent on the Holy Mount Kailas in *MOUNAM*, Silence, *Tapas*, to bring Waveless Silence and Light into the hearts and minds of all the seekers of Peace and all the men of finite vision in the East and the West.

For the past fifteen years or more, in spite of the fundless state of the Ashram, we have been trying, to keep Kailas alive, even though the furniture, and even the doors and windows of the buildings were stolen, taken away, by thieves. It hurts me to see that there is not one soul in all of Visakhapatnam, and nearby places, and even in all of India, spiritual India, who wants to see the glory of Kailas and to help to make it into a world Abode of Peace; although many *Rajas,Maharajas*, Ministers,ofState, Industrialists, Millionaires, and the Richest people had visited Kailas in the past fifteen years.

Suddenly 1 felt the urge from within. When no one else will help, I alone must do my part centering only in Self-Reliance, offering this life as a sacrifice to revive Kailas and protect the holy place, thus paving the way to World Peace.

In my closing years, in memory of the 77thBirthday, may Kailas be my humble offering to the world of Humanity, to come and realise God in Silence, in the indescribable surroundings of this holy place; with the great oceanbefore one, and all of Visakhapatnam on one side below; andon the other, a range of blue hills, among them the peak of the sacred Simhachalam, where Prahlada placed all his faith in the Lord; and the last hill, the Rishikonda, meeting the ocean, where legends tell us that *Rishis* stayed in deep meditation to raise suffering humanity above the finite consciousness of the little self. Who can describe the Lofty Vision of this Sacred Land, where the Earth meets the Sea and Sky, and Simhachalam sends forth its most pure waters, the Hanumantha Rivulet, to join all the stars, which one can almost touch with the hand, the Sky, Sea, and Shore, and the Holy Wind, the very Breath of God, in a living Song of Praise to God, the Indwelling Presence, Who resides not only in all this heavenly beauty, but in man, the Cosmic, Infinite Man of VISION.A HEARTY WELCOME awaits each and every seeker of Peace, Beauty and Truth in every religion, throughout the world.

Dr. Pitchayya, Dr. M. S. Rao,Sri BhashyamAppalacharyulu, Sri Tharakam and other consecrated souls who love me in the East and the West, whoseimpressions and blessings I cherish most; although this incidentmay appear trivial for men of the world, I am longing to learnsome deep helpful lesson from this simple incident.

In Lakshmi Vihar, Peace Centre, the usual *bhajan* withprayers was going on under the efficient care of Sri SadhuMarkandeya, Swami RamanandaThirthaji, Sri Sadhu Ram andother visitors from Alamur and Vizianagaram A. P., with Chy. Shanti and Ashram children. Nothing was wrong with mefeeling a bit tired with a longing to be alone with God, I didnot attend the prayers on that night. But following the urgewithin, the everprotecting Jnaneswari stayed with me insteadof going and attending prayers. I was healthy and happy and nothing wrong with me physically or mentally. I was sitting on a comfortable stool within one yard to my cot, havingtaken a few grapes and a plum fruit from the Ashram Dr. M. S. Rao offered by him lovingly for my use.

I was just thinking of shifting myself to my comfortable bed, but became unconscious, the head was bent down, unableto stir or move even to see, Jnaneswari felt anxious and alarmed and called Rajaji who was in the next room. He rushed and tried to lift me and reach the bed. Both of them were unable to move me, for, the life has gone. There was only the dead body. With the help of two more devotees the body was lifted with great difficulty and was laid on bed

in sorrow and mourning. 1 was called *Swamiji*, *Swamiji*, *Swamiji*, but there was no life, the sight was vacant; the breath has stopped; life flown somewhere. How can a dead man speak?

As it was the end of life and end of the world too, Chy. Shanti and other children were weeping sitting around the bed, with Prayers of SRI RAM JAI RAM JAI RAM OM.

There was complete darkness and sorrow in Lakshmi Vihar for several minutes and suddenly Jnaneswari cried out. "Swamiji is seeing! Life came back."

With a mile I asked, "Where amI?" unconscious of the surroundings. I was told that I was in Lakshmi Vihar- Peace Centre, amidst the members, devotees and visitors of the Ashram. Then I said: I was safe in His presence.

SadhuMarkandeyawho rushed to get the Doctor to testify or verify the death and that the life has gone out of the body, rushed with SriVasudevan and Doctor Nanjundan old devotees of the Ashram, to see me alive and even talking. Who can tell about the glory and blessings of God! This is not a case for the doctors to solve, not even to the Mystics to give out the answer.

Thus ended themarvellous episode of *parakayapravesam*, on the memorable night of 24th Friday. Since then I was unconsciously introspecting myself, with the one thought. Where was I taken for 15 minutes, leaving this body dead and inert? Has anyone taken me? Or did I go alone? How did I come back andenter the lifeless body, for the joy of all?

Whatever may be to mystics unknown and incomprehensible to the finite mortal mind, my heart longs to make this Astral, Mystical Experience, the greatest blessing - a real stepping stone, a helpful experienceof my life- to myself and to all those who love me.

Now, our question is how to live to a hundredyears. Since mind is our only support, we can certainlylive up to a hundred, but to attain anything, have wenot to pay the price for it? So also, to live to a hundred years, we have to follow the rules of health.

We have to take only sattwic* food. Not only infood and conduct, we must be moderate in everything, small or great. One must perform one's duty with regularity and joy.

Just as it is easy to take artificial food, live an artificial life, and die a premature death, it is also easy tolive to a hundred years or even more, by living a spiritual life, taking food of a *sattwic* nature and in moderation.

Often we learn from people, who have actually seen, that there are *yogis* in the Himalayas who havelived for hundreds of years,

Though some people may not be inclined to believe the longevity of the Himalayan Yogis, we often read in the newspapers that somebody somewhere lived up to one hundred and fifty, to one hundred and eighty years, taking a regulated *sattwic* diet and leading a naturallife.

In one place, in the Ashram, it is written 'Talkless, Meditate more.'

As I write this article, my inner voice advises ms to reduce this writing and these words, end to give the gistand my experience in as few words as possible.

Just, we will consider what leads to prematuredeath,

1. Unnatural, artificial life:

- a) Worshiping the stomach always with fish andflesh, spices, pickles, tamarind, oils etc.
- b) Eating in excess even without feeling hungry and suffering afterwards.
- c) Drinking wine, tea and coffee etc.
 - d) Smoking tobacco, which is poison in various forms.
 - e) Keeping awake till midnight, wasting time inuseless idle gossip.
 - f) Rising from bed long after sunrise.
 - g) Not finishing morning ablutions before sunrise.
 - h) Not giving the body any exercise.
 - i) Closing all doors and windows with a kerosene light burning inside the bed room.
 - j) Not having a free motion without having recourse to hot coffee and cigars.
 - k) Being slaves to lust, anger, envy etc.
 - 1) Eating something or other between the meals.

*non-stimulating, C/ Bhagawad Gita Xvi-8

- m) Gulping water while taking food, on the groundthat the food is hot with chilies.
- n) Taking a bath in hot water at midday instead of a bath in cold water, early in the morning.
- o) Putting food in the mouth in a hurry like fuel in aboiler and swallowing it without mastication, instead of taking food slowly and peacefully, thinking of God.
- p) Not taking water or lemon-juice after risingfrom bed.
- q) Not forming the habit of passing motion daily at a fixed time and consequently suffering from constipation for a number of days.
- r) Constantly thinking about food, drink and raiment end always desiring worldly, impermanentgoods.

Death extends its invitation every day, to people who are slaves to the caprices of nature.

- 2. Now, we will consider the rules of heath, naturalexercises. *Yoga sadhanas* and regulations of lifewhich are conducive to longevity, even upto ahundred years.
 - a) 'Early to bed and early to rise,' is the advice ofwise people, rising early between four and five O' clock and finishing all ablutions.
 - b) Soon after rising from bed, taking slowly one ortwo tumblerful of cold water or water mixedwith lemon juice (Hot water will be helpfulto those who suffer from constipation).
 - c) Practicing *Yoga asanas* or taking some exercise for 10 or 15 minutes, until there is perspiration in the body or according to circumstances, taking a long walk up to two or three miles taking the Divine name step after step.
 - d) Taking a cold bath in the sea orriver or near awell or even in one's bath room, rubbing thebody well with a towel.
 - e) Spending alone at least half an hour, in Prayerand Meditation, thinking of One's *ishta-devata* according to one's religions practices.
 - f) Slowly sipping fruit juice, milk or buttermilkwhichever is available and which suits one'sbody early in the morning, A Naturopath says, even water should be taken slowly as if chewingit. Sugar should not be added to milk and fruitjuice. If necessary honey or sugar candy maybe added.
 - g) Following one's daily routine of work, takingfood only when one feels hungry. Regulated sattwic food should be taken. Every morselshould be taken in the name of the Divine. Boiled vegetables and uncooked food shouldnecessarily be taken at least once a day. If some leaf vegetables, cucumbers and othervegetables are eaten slowly after due mastication, at least, once a day, one is never troubled by constipation.
 - h) While taking food, water should not be taken for each morsel.
 - i) If one feels thirsty it is good to take cold water one hour before or after meals
 - j) Even if compelled by friends, relations or nearones, one should not eat anything between onemeal and another.
 - k) As tea and other drinks are injurious to healththey should be treated as poison.
 - 1) Even if one is hungry, he should not overeatthough the food is delicious and tasty. Overeating is the root cause of all diseases.

That is why our ancients divided their stomachsinto four parts i.e. half of the stomach should be filled with solid food, one part with liquids andthe other part should be left vacant and filledwith air. By eating moderately and that tooonly when one feels hungry, living a regulatedlife and putting time to good use without wasting it in vain talk, all disease disappears.

- m) It is good and helpful if once in a week, onlyone meal is taken and fruit juice or some otherliquid for the other meal. Once in fifteen dayson the eleventh day of the new moon or fullmoon, one has to observe complete fast and coldwater or cold water with lemon juice added to it should be taken, to slake thirst. At least, once in a month a day should be spent in solitude and silence in some Ashram if possible, without any worldly thoughts and in the studyof religious books and meditation.
- n) In the evenings, at sunset, it is good to take abrisk walk or some exercise for ten or fifteenminutes till the body perspires and then take abath. People advanced in age may take theirbath in tepid water. At least, once in a fortnight one should take an oil bath.
- o) As in the morning, in the evening also, at least, for half an hour, one has to pray and meditateon God and enjoy the experience of the Self.
- p) Attending to one's routine work, one has totake a *sattwic* diet which conduces to longevityand health, and go to bed early.
- q) Celibacy ensures long life. It gives aluster to the face and also gives the experience of theself which is one without a second.
- r) At the time of going to bed, one has to retrospect and examine the life he led that day. (Whether he did his work remembering God ornot, whether he fell a victim to any weakness) and firmly resolve not to repeat that mistakenoting all his activities in a diary and going tobed remembering God.
- s) One must enjoy unity within his breath which constantly says, days and nights, "soham-soham-I am the atma, I am the atma" whetherone knows it or not- and follow the breath asthe divine effulgence of soham which is eternal, pure, permanent and perfect. Then one can live not only to a hundred years but canlive even as long as he likes.

Dear Readers of Peace magazine!

If you want to live a hundred years, and if you wantto fulfill the purpose of this human life which is so difficult to attain, begin to follow the rules of health whichhelp your gross body, not at some future time but rightnow.

Rise from the bed early in the morning and beginto practice *Yoga-asanas* or take some exercise till your body perspires.

In your daily activities, in all your trials try to observe the rules of love so that you may enjoy mentalbliss.

To attain spiritual progress, to establish peace, prayand meditate regularly, not when your body (which isfull of anxieties, numerous diseases and troubles) becomes infirm but now when the body is fit, attain *jivanmukti*- which is the goal of human existence.

Can there be two swords in onesheath? There is no darkness where the Sun is present. There cannot belight where there is darkness. Where there is illhealth and fear, health and courage cannot exist.

Perfect health is your birthright. Why should youthink of disease? Always think of health and be healthy. The scriptures in dealing with the illusion of the ropeand the snake, say, that if the rope is recompensed, there is no snake, and if the snake is seen, there is no rope.

Try to express in your lives, the essence of the small verse written by the sageAshtavakra and crossthe ocean of existence, realizing the self.

When the rope is not known, it appears as a snake When the rope is known, there is no snake When the self is not known, the entire universeappears When the self is realized, the universe disappear.

May the All Merciful Lord fill you with the realisation of the self, bless you with health and longevity, and make you attain the seat of immortality and liveforever and ever!

God's ways are inscrutable and incomprehensibleto the finite, human mind. How He uses us as Hischosen instruments! In the first year the LakshmiVilla Bungalow was taken for a month only rent-freefrom the *zamindarini* of Dasapalla Estate - on condition that it should be vacated after a month. In thesecond year it was taken for two months to serve Hischildren. In the third year it was taken permanentlyto serve as a **Peace Centre** for the benefit of allHis aspiring children! How good is God!

My life work of nearly 44 years in all our Ashrams and their properties have been registered in the name of a Committee consisting of well-known, selfless and dedicated souls, so that everything that was in my name could be used to serve God'children in all the world, irrespective of theman-made differences in caste, creed, colour and nationality. Hence, the great need of *Viswamatha Jyothi Prarthanalayam*—the **PRAYER HALL OF UNIVERSAL LIGHT** for the common worship and for the use of the votaries of all faiths. But it is more of the physical health of the body thatmy devotees wish to know. But the body is only a passing cloud, it is a mere wave in the Oceanof *Akhanda*, *Sat*, *Chit*, *Ananda*, the Existence, Knowledge and Bliss Absolute. Anyway the simple question makes me feel embarrassed and I wonderwhat to say to satisfy my visitors and devotees.

Am I the body or the *atman*, the Soul, the One without asecond? As *atman*, the Splendour of Millions of Suns, the Light pervades and permeates the very cells of the body. I ammore concerned about the Health and Peace of the *atman*, the Soul and of others, than of the passing body.

48. HOW TO FEEL GOD'S PRESENCE ALWAYS?

The answer to this vital question, the solution of this Soul-awakening theme, lies in your conception of God.

If your conception of God is finite and limited, you can never feel His Presence ceaselessly. If your God is confined to a religion or creed, to a temple or church, you can never feel Him ceaselessly. If your God is confined to heaven or sky, to a dogma or fanatical belief, you can never feel Him ceaselessly. If your God is confined to a name or form, to a time or place you can never feel Him ceaselessly.

First let us try to understand the full meaning of the simple word CEASELESSLY. Have you ever watched oil being poured from one vessel into another vessel? Did you notice how it falls in a stream of continuous current, without any break in its course and runs in a ceaseless flow? Your mind also has to run towards God, ceaselessly in unbroken flow. This is a helpful simile for a steady uninterrupted and concentrated meditation.

This state of steadiness is explained in *DHARANA*, *DHYANA* and *SAMADHI* concentration, meditation, Cosmic Consciousness, *NIRVIKALPA SAMADHI*, or Trance. Now let us come to the true conception of God, He is Omnipresent, Omnipotent and Omniscient. He is at the same time interpenetrating the very cells of your being. If so, you are in God and God is already in you *TAT TWAM ASI*. THOU ART THAT. As God is ONE WITHOUT A SECOND, as nothing else exists besides Him, you are THAT already.

GOD HAS NO OTHER BODY ON EARTH THAN YOURS. How wonderful! He is working through you. God is moving and breathing through you. Not a blade in of grass moves without His will. I am writing now because of His Presence. You are reading now, my loving readers, because of His Presence, In the real conception of God, He is seeing through your eyes, hearing through your ears, working through your body and thinking and functioning through your senses and mind. Verily, He is throbbing in your heart and flowing in your very breath. How close and near is God, closer than your hands, your feet, your very breath!

Indeed, He is the Breath of the breath. He is the Universal Breath-SOHAMBreath that embraces all excluding none, but including everything. Even the dumb animals, plants, herbs and flowers are included in God's Presence. It is He who is shining in the stars, the sun and the moon and other planets. How blessed it is not to be earth-bound! Let us crawl with the insects; let us fly with the birds; let us sing and play with the children. God is not only in the form of the flowers, birds, and men; He comes to us in the form of the critic, an enemy, to test our mettle and the love that we bear in our hearts. Blessed are they who can repeat even from the Cross, facing God even in their persecutors. "FATHER, FORGIVE THEM, FOR, THEY KNOW NOT WHAT THEY DO." In my religion there is nothing like FORGIVENESS, for, all is God.

The *Crucifixion* as well as the *Resurrection* are one andthe same unto those blessed and rare souls who have the correct and real conception of God, Just the other daywe received a letter from a lady who is the Editor of Animal Champion, finding fault with us for not writing in our Peace journal, advocating the protection of their lives and removal of the sufferings of the Dumb Animal Friends. I appreciate her kindness towards the animals and sympathy for their sufferings. But I feel sorry for her unkindness or harshness towards her fellow-beings, who are kind and good in their daily life of compassion.

As I am writing this message both the Bada Ramiand Chota Rami are near me, as if asking me to send their love to the Animal Champion lady in the far off England. In our Ashram we have nearly a hundred cows, bulls, calves, all living on our love. Not only we love and take care of them but we consider all these dumb animals as a part and parcel of our lives, the living images of God. In loving and serving any of the least of His children, we are only loving God! The only difference is that we do not broadcast and advertise our work; but feel content in our silent service, without expecting any reward.

While I am engaged in writing this message, sittingunder the cool shade of a mango tree, it made me happy to see a doctor coming to see me, offering his selfless services to serve the sick and the poor. Two sisters came and sang devotional songs that touched my heart. In all these simple incidents, I see God and I feel His Presence. It gives me joy to face Him in everyone. The sun shines in the day time. In the night it is dark. Yet, in the Sun there is always sunshine. The wind blows; sometimes it stops too. The waves in the ocean rise high and they go down too. In everything in this world, there appears duality, cold and heat; light and darkness, sickness andhealth, poverty and wealth, ignorance and knowledge. God alone is the Changeless One. He is above all changes.

How to feel His Presence ceaselessly is the problem of problems? In the outer life, awareness of His Presence ceaselessly seems to be almost impossible. Inadvertence comes at every step. Forgetfulness seems to be the nature of the mind. The mind of even the learned and wise, is so fickle and restless, always thinking and imagining both useful and useless things. The only way, the helpful way seems to be, to merge within, to introspect over one's life, to be still but to know in stillness that we are a part and parcel of God. In stillness we realize that there is something within, in every man and woman, even in the dumb animals too, that which is flowing ceaselessly in their very breath, with each and every inhalation and exhalation.

Inhale and Exhale Peace:-This is the greatest help to realize God, if only we could follow ceaselessly our own breath. *SOHAM* is the Universal Energy. It is the essence and soul of all creeds and religion, *SOHAM* is the *MANTRAM* of *MANTRAMS*. It is the *MAHAMANTRA*, the Holiest affirmation that makes us feel His Presence, Now and Here, immediately. Let us only have the strength to feel and feel His Omnipresence; and to be eternally centered in God, the Universal Energy.

Let us close now with the VEDIC PEACE CHANT, with the prayer that it may lead us into that ceaseless flow of God-consciousness, which is the soul of man and the goal of humanity!
