





IT IS INDEED a privilege to write the Foreword to the selections from the spontaneous writings and inspired utterances of the Sage of Shanti Ashram, published as his 71st Birthday Souvenir; but it is a heavy responsibility too, if not a childish audacity. How can a layman like this humble writer evaluate in feeble expression the perennial springs of the Spirit? How can a seasoned sinner dive into the depths of the soul of Omkar? But that is what I am commanded to do.

To commune with Swamiji even in cold print, one feels exalted; even as one feels elevated in his warming presence. Thus the letter and the spirit get merged as one message manifested in the life of the Master.

The Soul of Omkar is a spiritual sputnik floating in space, ceaselessly transmitting "cosmic flashes" from the starry skies - ageless gospels and endless verities. It is for the receivers to tune in their sets to celestial spheres, lest they miss the sweet melodies, more so because they are unheard.

This publication is a choice collection, mostly from the writings of the modern messenger of Peace-productions of his "Hours of Silence". It appropriately opens with a prayer which has now become famous throughout the world as a remarkable supplication for Peace. It is profitably analysed in the next elucidation by a reputed scholar, and ably assisted by two sisters.

Swamiji's messages begin with the "legacy" in general he has bequeathed to generations yet unborn. Before sorting the gems, the splendid wares are affectionately advertised by an exemplary disciple who has reverentially stored them, and made out of chosen ones an attractive necklace for herself.

Kumari Jnaneswari, the heir of his heart and the successor of his soul, has arranged the precious stones in such an artistic fashion, which is

truly fascinating. When a devoted disciple has borne witness to the benefits she has derived from Omkar's teachings it is for others to follow his "Jeevan veda", dedicated to humanity at large. As one after another the valuable ones are turned, as beads in a rosary of variegated hues, one stands awestruck, when, in no time, the revolving colours reveal the one shining White.

Peace, the central theme recurring in these pages, and its inward realisation through constant communion with his Maker, are the primary concern of man, before he tries to spread it far and wide. It is indeed, in the poet's words, "the one increasing purpose running through the ages".

"Man belongs to man; man is entitled to man". If only this dying call of Albert Schweitzer is heard by humanity, the much longed for, Kingdom of God

will be established on this planet. Swamiji asks us all to do a simple thing, to "shift your Peace Centre from without to within. What you desire the entire world to do, practise it yourself". This is a duty that can be trifled with only at your own peril. Self-reformation is his prescription for the woebegotten man.

"Our Peace must be based on the understanding of God". This is the keynote struck by Omkar, for lasting world peace. In proclaiming that the "highest worship of God is the service of man", which makes the world "an abode of Peace", he is recalling to us the abiding message of his ancestors of the Upanishadic era. He warns us not to delay action but to do the good deed in the "eternal present", here and now.

Prostrating before the One without a second, he feels His ineffable Presence as "wonderful". Next he proceeds to present his readers with a bunch of flowers gathered on the Kotagiri Hills. Nature fills him with ecstasy and he jumps with the joy of a new discovery that he is the "richest" man in the world. In his own original way he defines the richest man as one who is desireless and selfless.

He gives us a cue to becoming rich: "Give while you live, for, give you must". That indeed is the reverberating message in his musings. Akin to this is his assertion that he is the "healthiest" man too. Despite his bodily ailments, he shares with his readers the secret of his health, in an autobiographical touch when he says: "He is interpenetrating the very cells of my being".

"Health is your birthright but not sickness," he says, and cheers us in this outright way. He himself has been writing messages from his sick bed, and not writhing in anguish. That is possible only for a spiritual being like Omkar.

He further follows it up with the most enviable declaration that he is the "happiest" man. Is it not a natural corollary? With his extraordinary wealth and health, can he be otherwise than being supremely happy?

"Happiness is in union with God" is his re-discovery for us, the poor, ailing; miserable folk. For being happy his simple recipe is "think of others. There are no 'others' than the living images of your own Self, the One indivisible God. Love all these". Swamiji has presented this tricoloured bouquet for the new year. In simplicity, how sublime! Indeed he lives in a world of his own "Where everything is God", as Swami Ramananda Thirthaji, a peer of his, bears testimony.

Sister Sushila Devi has rendered a signal service by making available to us the marvellous "Niagara Falls", seen by the readers through the mystic vision of Swami Omkar.

"Pour out, pour out all that you have, for you cannot keep it." How resounding and thrilling is this poetic commandment, the be-all and end-all of religion!

Rescued from oblivion, the courtesy of Sri Jagdish has donated to the readers a rare speech, delivered by Swamiji forty years ago in the United States of America. It is as fresh and valid today as it was decades ago, for its prophetic presentation of eternal values.

He boldly defines his religion as Universal Love. It has captivated my heart as it is sure to grip many others too. In fact it is the undercurrent of his outpourings.

"I have no religion of my own which is separate from myself', is at once a subjective and objective statement. This is the glory of Omkar. This nondenominational universal love is the foundation of the one world of which our leaders glibly talk. "Under heaven, one family" - this is the essence as also the climax of Swamiji's clarion call. "It is good to be born in a Church, but it is better to die outside it", is an aphorism not without significance.

As a fitting finale to Swamiji's exhortations for Peace is his latest message of topical interest - *Satyameva Jayathi* - his anguished call for the outright outlawry of war from this trembling world. He asks India "to cling to the never-failing Divine Protector". In a moving peroration, filled with pathos, this standing sentinal from the hill-top cries hoarse, to the so-called civilised world.

"In order to stop this carnage and death, we must recognise God, the living Truth, and thus bring peace and goodwill to the individuals as well as nations. Let us cling to Truth more than ever in these troubled times and the great crisis of the nation."

Tranquility amidst turmoil - that is the picture of Swami Omkar. "Restore leadership to God" is his appeal.

In conveying simple truths with homely illustrations, like Vemana of old, Omkarji is peerless. His is not a Pose, but a poise; not an intellectual precept but a perpetual practice of the Presence of God.

What is his philosophy? It is a common question asked by people when an uncommon man echoes truths heard from the corridors of time. This piligim's philosophy and religion mingle in one ceaseless quest of the ultimate source, seeking the One in the many. Vedic in vision, Islamic in concept, Biblical in exposition, Buddhistic in application,

May Peace and Goodwill abide among individuals as well as communities and nations!



WHAT I LEARNT FROM SWAMIJI

- 1. I learnt from Swamiji that God is love and love is God and where love is, there God is.
- 2. I learnt from Swamiji that religion and life are not two but one. Hence God is equally present when my eyes are closed in my meditation as when my eyes are open while typing a message or doing any other work.
- *3.* / learnt from Swamiji that work is worship. Everything I do is an offering to God.
- 4. I learnt from Swamiji the preciousness of time that every moment is precious, and he who wastes moments wastes all his life. Anything lost can be regained but not invaluable and precious time.
- 5. I learnt from Swamiji that laziness is a dangerous disease and a lazy man harms himself and others. Indeed, he who is lazy and does not work for his living, has no right to eat.
- 6. I *learnt from Swamiji* that cleanliness is Godliness. He who is clean within and without is a true child of God.
- 7. I learnt from Swamiji that purity is the very foundation and basis of spiritual life. Blessed are they who are pure in thought, word and deed.

- 8. I learnt from Swamiji to inhale and exhale Peace with each and every breath. This is the simple and natural Pranayama, the breathing exercise that purifies all the Nadis (the nerves within), which alone helps in the long run to awaken the Kundalini or the latent Shakti, which makes one God-conscious without the need of any secret, mystical exercises that are complicated and may also be dangerous and harmful, especially without proper guidance.
- 9. I learnt from Swamiji the simple way of Lord Christ to love thy neighbour as thyself; the direct way of Blessed Krishna to face Him in everyone, considering all the world as Brahman; the compassionate way of Buddha to respect all life and to be kind and merciful.
- 10. I learnt from Swamiji the universality of all religions, to respect and adore all the Saviours, Avatars and Prophets of every religion, to assimilate all that is good from every source and never to compare the different religions or their Prophets and Saviours.
- 11. I learnt from Swamiji that I should not be a little frog in the well of ignorance but should be broad-minded and wise, considering the wide world as my home and all people in it as my sisters and brothers. How blessed it is to love and serve all, without expecting a reward in any form. This is my highest religion.
- 12. / learnt from Swamiji that the practice of feeling the Presence of God, not now and then, but in each and every moment of one's life is the secret of success and God-realization.
- 13. I learnt from Swamiji about the glory of self-reliance: to rely no more on outside props, on the big forms and names, but to rely on the Light within.
- 14. I learnt from Swamiji that speech is silver and silence is gold. Mownam silence is the ornament, nay, the crown of spiritual life. Too much talking leads to misunderstanding and trouble. Silence leads to perfect Peace and creates souls.
- 15. I learnt from Swamiji that troubles are God's rain on earth, and never to trouble the trouble until the trouble troubles us.




- 16. I learnt from Swamiji that forgetfulness of God is death, and perpetual awareness of His Presence is life eternal.
- 17. I learnt from Swamiji that I should be kind and forbearing in all the tests and trials of the world, as they are mere passing clouds. Verily, tests and trials are always for the brave, and life in the world is not a bed of roses. The world is not like a sweet rice pudding.
- 18. I learnt from Swamiji that when wealth is lost, nothing is lost; when health is lost, something is lost; but when character is lost, all is lost. Verily character is the heart and soul of God-life.
- 19. I learnt from Swamiji that the Atman, the Soul within, is ever complete, that there is nothing to learn from out-side, and that one should unlearn and forget all that one has learnt. Real Peace does not belong to the bookworms but only to those kind rare souls who have risen above duality of every kind. In the highest stage, sages consider books as firebrands, although they are helpful for the beginners.
- 20. / learnt from Swamiji that we need a boat to cross the river of life. When once we cross it, why cling anymore to the boat of the body? The ocean is God, the river is life, and the body is the boat.
- 21. I learnt from Swamiji that I should never be satisfied by chewing dry bones the empty words of others nor be contented by counting the cows in all the world. It is better to have a small cow of our own that gives us even a few ounces of fresh milk. It is personal experience that counts and helps in the long run.

Those who are blessed with personal experience are the salt of the earth. They are the beacon lights of the world, leading us from the unreal to the Real, from death to Life, and from mortality to Immortality.

THE PEACE CENTRES

IN THESE DAYS of silence there is a great longing more than ever to start Peace Centres both in the East and the West, all over the world, not on land, but in each and every individual heart. It is so easy to start Peace Centres within, provided one is willing to pay the price of complete self-surrender for establishing it within, from where alone Peace flows ceaselessly towards all the children of God in the world, irrespective of the difference in caste, creed, colour and nationality.

What are the indispensable requisites to start a Peace Centre within?

I. To begin with, knowing the preciousness of human birth, one must wish, pine and intensely aspire with all the strength of his mind, heart and soul, to seek and realize God before the call in the form of death approaches.

Regular study of your scriptures, be it the Gita or Bible or any of your religious books, even for fifteen minutes everyday, will be helpful in your spiritual progress.

- II. One must memorize and repeat the simple Peace prayer at least twice, when one wakes up at dawn and also when he retires in the night to sleep. The more one repeats the Peace Prayer both during work and while at rest, the more it gives joy, inner strength and Peace.
- III. The sacred scriptures say Paropakarardham idam Sareeram this body is given only for service. So let us serve His children by spreading Peace from heart to heart, by making them repeat the Peace Prayer, as it helps to feel God's Divine Presence while repeating it.
- IV. As it is the individual Peace that paves the way towards universal Peace, by establishing Peace in our hearts and spreading it near and far, we are really contributing to, the Peace of the world.

- V. In the Peace Centre one need not struggle to learn any more from outside and from the finite teachers, for everything is within oneself inside, in the stillness of one's own purified and dedicated heart. All that a man has to do is to forget all his superficial knowledge and all that he has learnt from outside. The message of the Peace Centre within is always self-reliance in the beginning, middle and end and no more reliance and trust on outside props.
- VI. Let the Peace thought Peace within and without, Peace everywhere and all around us be more prominent than the thoughts of fear, strife, bitterness and war. May all be peaceful everywhere!

My dear loving readers, will you not help us by establishing Peace in your devoted heart first, then in your home, community, nation and world at large, now, in the living present moment? Let charity begin at home. Let Peace begin now alone in your aspiring heart of devotion, and thus fill your home and radiate it near and far wherever you go. Aspire to be a holy shadow spreading Peace unconsciously.

Time is too precious to be wasted in mere words, discourses and lectures. The bullets without powder are not helpful. What we need is soul-force, the Love Universal and the supreme Peace, which includes all.

Due to Maya, delusion, man is not yet ready to pay the price and start the Peace Centre within. He would rather start a branch of the Ashram or Society on land, by collecting subscriptions going from door to door so that he can be president, founder, or at least its secretary or manager. In the outer branches there is no need of paying the price of killing the ego and annihilating the little self.

Due to association with wrong people, who run after the fleeting clouds of name and fame, the ignorant man neglects the Peace within and runs after the Peace without, like a sheep forgetting the roaring lion. O man, wake up! It is high time to start a Peace Centre within yourself from where Peace alone should flow ceaselessly in torrents and rivers.

Recognise the highest, the most natural and the unutterable Mantram and be silent. Knowing That, they melt in Silence.

"How shall I worship Thee? May I worship Thee in Silence, in waveless Silence?" The highest worship which is dearest and nearest to God is, to love. Love all, for all are His children, the living images. Love ye each other as I have loved ye.



May character be the richest wealth. Next comes health, the greatest blessing of man. The man who is healthy is always wealthy, at least mentally. The man who is blessed with wealth and shares it with God's sick and poor children, is the happiest man in all the world. The giver is always blessed and not the beggar. As children of God, may we be privileged to give and share, not only our physical wealth but also our mental health with others. It certainly tells upon our body, mind and thoughts immediately. There may be one in a million who can eat anything like a *Jivanmukta*, one liberated in life, who is above body, mind and world, who can eat anything and do anything. Lay people, the ordinary people who are slaves of the senses, should not take the exception of such souls as an example and eat everything, which is harmful to health and Peace of mind, especially flesh that excites their unruly senses. We are always safe by trying to walk in the footprints of the saints and sages who are contented to live on fruits such as oranges, bananas, nuts and other vegetables that are conducive to spiritual life. Milk, buttermilk, wheat, pounded rice and cereals of all kinds are helpful to health. Leafy vegetables and fruit juices keep the elimination clean and clear, blessing the votaries of simple, natural diet with blooming health.

Someone says: "An apple a day keeps the doctor away." A naturopath says: "If you live only on one coconut a day and nothing else, you will live more than a hundred years without sickness of any kind, radiating health." Another says that fasting at least once in a while on holy days such as *Ekadasi*, full moon etc., is also very helpful to keep up good health. A wise man says—giving a vast margin to fasting and feasting—the following words: "God-realisation is your goal; you must feel Him now and here."

If you can feel God's Presence by fasting, do it now. If you can feel His Presence by feasting, do so. At any cost, realise God—the goal of your precious human birth, by fasting or feasting—whatever helps you to reach the heights now.

Health is the greatest God-given blessing to man. It is we who misuse it with wrong diet, wrong habits and wrong life, being slaves of the senses.

Especially when they are sick, they never eat or stuff themselves, but fast and sleep in a corner in silence until they get well. "Return to Nature or go back to Nature; be natural." These are simple laws that make people restful, healthy and wise.

It was fifty years ago that I went for the first time to America, where it was the custom of all people to get their teeth examined and cleansed once in six months. They call it a check-up of teeth. My friends there took me also to a famous dental surgeon for the check-up. Imagine my surprise and joy, when the dentist, after examining my teeth said that in all his experience of examining thousands of people, he never saw such strong and perfect teeth in anyone.

When he asked me the cause of such perfect teeth, I smiled and said:"It is because my teeth never saw any dentist so far in India and it is the first time that they are having a check-up in America." All glory belongs to God.

All that I can say of my health is that God has been too good to me, in spite of my wrong use or misuse of my health. Even after the heart trouble, when I was asked not to go up the hills or have long rides in cars, once I felt that I should see the *Jiva Samadhi* of Sri Raghavendra Swamiji in Manthralayam, which is at a distance of nearly forty mile, from Adoni. *Jiva Samadhi* means getting buried in the ground when alive, never to come out again. When I expressed a wish that I should like to see and meditate for some time at the *Jiva Samadhi* of Sri. Raghavendraji, I was told that the road was in very bad condition and that even jeeps were going there with difficulty. I insisted that I should see that holy place at any cost. A good jeep was arranged. The road was so bad that the ride in it was like riding on a horse. I was sorry for my hasty venture, for my heart began to, palpitate and work like an engine inside. By God's special Grace we had a rough ride of nearly eighty miles to and fro, with the pounding or pumping of the heart within. But nothing happened and here I am healthy,

happy and contented, having got my wish satisfied by visiting Mantralayam, where we made new friends for our Ashram and the cause of Peace. It is a restful and peaceful place where Mahatmas spend their time in Mahasamadhi; hence, we all enjoyed our visit there in spite of the very rough ride.

Coming back to my present health, the well-known Rotarian, Dr. Venkateswaran, visited our Peace Centre the other day, and of his own accord examined my body thoroughly, including the blood pressure, and pronounced that everything was normal.

How good is God! In spite of my heart malady and the present tooth trouble, has not God been too good to me by blessing me with health and Peace? Hence I take joy in saying that I am the healthiest man in the world. At least, let me have the consolation to say that I too am one of the healthiest persons in God's creation.

Strange and unbelievable as it may sound, as I began to write this message on the *Healthiest Man*, the little pain, the troublesome toothache suddenly disappeared. There is health and peace within and without. I feel so grateful to the indwelling Light, the God of all understanding and mercy. At His infinite compassion and limitless love, my eyes often become wet with tears of gratitude.



Q: O happiness, where art thou?

A: Happiness is in union with God.

Q: Where is God?

A: God is within, in the stillness of your own purified heart.

God-realisation now and here, is the message of the day. It has been the essence of my life's aspiration. If you cannot feel His Presence here and now, how can you feel Him in the uncertain, dim future? If you can feel God's Presence now, you can feel His Presence always and forever. Verily He is ever with you, within you and around you. Being omnipresent, He is pervading and permeating the very cells of your being as well as the universe, now and always, nay, eternally. Indeed happiness is in union with God and God is all-in-all. So our happiness is in oneness with the manifested world. Whether we like it or not, for realising happiness or peace we *must* feel our oneness with each and every one, the known and the unknown, with those who love us and even with those who criticise and condemn us.

Love is universal. It is one without a second. Call it God, Peace, happiness or Soul or Substance or Divine Energy. Names mean nothing, for that which exists is One, as often repeated, and It is called by various names by sages in different climes. What is most essential is our identification with the Real, the Highest. The awareness of that Presence now and here, consciously and from personal experience is the soul and goal of precious human birth.

If you are aware of His Presence, the indwelling Presence, the interpenetrating Presence, now and here, you are the happiest man in all the world. Happiness is never in selfishness. Selfishness and happiness are poles apart. There is as much distance and difference as from the north pole to south pole, and between light and darkness. The happiest man is never selfish. He never lives for himself. He always lives for the happiness of others. Hence he is ever happy. There is a favourite saying of mine that I often repeat:

If you want to be miserable think of yourself;

If you want to be happy think of others.

"Others" are no other than the living images of the one indivisible God—your own various forms of the One in the many. Love of these is real love of God.

There is a small inspiring story that depicts the glory of selfless service in simple words.

It seems that once a Guru initiated his disciple into a great Mantra (sacred affirmation), but warned him to keep it a secret and never to reveal it to anyone under any circumstance. The Guru went so far as to warn his Chela, "If you tell this Mantra to anyone, your head will be broken into a thousand pieces."

The Chela faithfully repeated the holy Mantra and found it very efficacious. He thought: "How can I enjoy all this infinite bliss when thousands, nay, millions of people are steeped in darkness and ignorance?" So the next day he invited all the people, and climbing a mountain-top, he disclosed the Mantra to them and requested all to repeat it and thus realise God then and there.

When the Guru heard of this, the disciple was sent for and asked why he disobeyed and disrespected the ardent wishes of the Guru, his Master.

The disciple with bowed head said: "O Master, my loving Guru! How can I alone enjoy the rich spiritual food, the nectar of immortality, when millions are starving and dying in ignorance? Let their happiness be my happiness. Let the Peace of others be my Peace. When millions are being saved, what if one single soul like myself goes to destruction?

The Guru felt pleased with the utter selflessness of his Chela and blessed him with the happiness and Peace that passeth all understanding.

Thus we see, my friends, my loving readers that our real happiness is only in sharing what we have with others, the children of God, irrespective of the differences of caste, creed, colour and nationality. Hence Santi Ashram extends to you all a hearty welcome. It is the common property of all the children of God in the East and the West. It is *my legacy* to all the aspiring souls who are seeking Peace. The Peace and happiness that cannot be bought for any amount of wealth, you can have it free in your own Abode of Peace.

Man, in the deep delusion of Maya, seeks happiness everywhere outside, where it is not. It is within himself in the stillness of his own purified heart. Man's ignorant search in the outer world reminds one of the unfortunate and sad state of the musk deer that searches for the musk on hills and dales instead of within itself, and finally perishes in pain and sorrow, getting its heart pierced by the sharp branch of a tree. O man! It is high time that you sought happiness which is within yourself now and here, instead of running after Swamis, Yogis, Babas and all the exterior Mahatmas. Time is too precious to be wasted on the futile search, running after the shadows by forgetting the substance within.

Recently, one of the oldest devotees of the Ashram, Mrs U. Narayanarao Manoram of Bangalore, during her visit to the Peace Centre, was singing her favourite song of Nam Dev, which gave me great happiness.

Here is the essence of the song:

Whether this body goes or remains,

I will be staunch in my faith to you,

I shall never forsake Thy Feet,

I shall always repeat Thy sacred Name

Dear God, it is left to you to see

That I keep my above promise.

As a boy I memorised from *Ashtavakra Gita*, a similar helpful verse that says: "Let this body remain a thousand years or let it go now, what is that to me, the immortal Atman, which is self-effulgent, ever shining, without decay or growth".

The following verse from the sacred scriptures has also given me immense joy:

"I suffered much because of the delusion of duality or separation. Now I have seen the Light, I have known what is to be known, I am centred in the Lights of lights, the one, indivisible God; for nothing else exists besides Him. He is the source of all joy and happiness".

What else is there to be said? O happiness! Where art thou? Thou art in utter selflessness. Thou art there where the little self is completely annihilated, where all desires are burnt up in the fire of Godconsciousness. Happiness is there where one thinks not of another, where

Let our happiness be centred in recognising His Omnipresence, Omnipotence and Omniscience now, in the present living moment. Here alone abides the holy mind of eternal happiness. Happiness is to be sought in the Changeless and never in the fleeting clouds of the everchanging world.

God is the only changeless One. Hence the changeless happiness is to be found only in God, the Eternal, the Infinite and the Immortal. In my childishness and in my childish way, I find myself unconsciously conversing with God.

I whisper sometimes: "Where art Thou, my God?"

In His still, small voice, He replies, "Lo! I am beside you, my child."

Sometimes I spend precious time in the company of people, talking too much. After I return from them and when alone with God in silence, I say unconsciously, "Have I forgotten Thee, my God? Did I neglect Thee amidst the confusion of company with too much talk, even though all was done in Thy Name? Verily, Thou art Silence."



MY RELIGION

MY DEAR blessed images of God! I bow to you in deep adoration for the privilege given to me of expressing to you my inner thoughts on religion.

I greet you not as a philosopher or lecturer, not even as a Swami; I do not greet you either as an Easterner coming from far-away India or as a Hindu belonging to this religion or that creed. I love to greet you as one of your own flesh and blood, having the common heritage of God as our only Father and Creator. As we are the children of the same Almighty Father, I greet you as your own brother.

Our present subject is "My Religion". This is needed by one and all, especially in these days of civilisation, when the world is filled with numberless sects, creeds, organisations, societies, lodges, centres, etc., in the name of God and religion.

Indeed it has become a fad or fashion for everyone to connect himself or herself with some sect or society.

When once they enroll as members of some church or organisation, then peace reigns to an extent both in themselves and among the circle of people with whom they are connected. Otherwise, some people, making long faces, will remark, "My, look at her, even though she is sixty years of age, she is not attending church!" or others will say, "Her son is as big as an ass and she never sends him to Sunday School!"

Thus we see that when one visits a church or temple, the care of his soul is handed over to the priest or master who is in charge. One promises to pay his dues regularly. If the dues are not paid, his name will be struck off and the doors of salvation closed. Can we be religious by enrolling our names in all the sects and societies of the world? Can we be religious even by visiting all the churches and temples of the world? Can we be religious even though we read all the holy books of the whole world? Can we be religious by contacting or becoming monks and popes

of the whole world? Can any outside thing make us religious? Can we get religion even from grand masters and great popes? Can religion be imparted? Is it outside of us? Is it not eternally one with us? Now let me dwell on some of these vital questions.

My dear friends, at the very outset let me confess to you that I have no religion of my own which is separate from me. But do not take me for a heathen or atheist. My religion has been eternally one with me. In fact religion to me is a part and parcel of my own Self.

My religion is the religion of Universal Love, which is seeing everything with these tender eyes. It is the same which is manifesting itself in the eyes of

all of you. My religion is the religion of the inner heart, which throbs with feelings of love and oneness, radiating the same to the whole of humanity.

Do not think that I am confining my religion to this body or to another form or name. Religion, the highest expression of God, can never be confined to any form or name, nor even to any creed or time.

My religion is the religion that flutters in the leaves. It is the religion that sings in the birds. My religion is the religion that hovers in the winds. My religion is the religion that shines in the sun. My religion is the religion that pervades all things and beings, from the tiniest atom to the mightiest planet.

My religion is not confined to the human kingdom alone. It is my religion alone that is throbbing in all the kingdoms of life. I exalt myself in my own Divinity by calling you all as my own. My joy lies in embracing you all, sharing your joys and woes as mine. Can there be any greater privilege than embracing the whole of humanity or creation in the arms of Universal Love?

This is my religion. Call it mine or yours. To me, religion is this great indivisible love and indescribable oneness. This ought to be the real religion of every earnest soul. This must be the practical religion of all seekers of Truth. Whether we ignore it or admit it, this is the religion of all seekers of Truth; it remains always as the changeless Truth.

In short, religion is the realisation of one's Divinity or Godhead. Religion is to reign in the glory of contentment and self-satisfaction sitting on the throne of Universal Love!

Indeed, in the name of religion, robberies have been committed, murders have been done and slaughter of innocent souls has taken place. Even suicides and homicides have been perpetrated; every heinous crime known to the world has been committed in the name of religion.

Our blessed Lord Jesus was mercilessly crucified in the name of religion. Indeed, it is in the name of religion that saints in every age have had to drink their hemlock and thus stand as martyrs of religions.

Are we really to blame religion for all these crimes? Indeed, it is the so-called religion which is the root cause of all sins and crimes, both in the past and the present, all over the world, but never is it the real religion of Universal Love. It is the religion of love 'that made Christ offer his body as a willing sacrifice and utter the great prayer, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." It is the religion of compassion and truth that made the great Buddha offer his life to save a simple dove in a cruel sacrifice.

In true religion there is no space for any strife or difference, nor for duality in any form. Here one cannot even raise a finger against anther, or allow the mouth to utter a harsh word, Verily, in this religion of love, one cannot have ill-feeling or hatred even in one's mind. When a man feels that his religion is the religion of the universe, that everything and everyone belongs -to him, he cannot help loving all, irrespective of caste, creed, colour and nationality.

So long as man believes in a religion that is separate from him; however, sublime it may be, he cannot help but become a dupe to ignorance and weakness in some form or another. It is only when man believes in the religion which is never separate from him and is eternally inseparable from him, that he will not only be free from all strife and weakness, but will also shine as an emblem of God or religion.

I desire to define both God and religion. In the highest sense they are both one and the same. Many define religion as the path leading to God! God is the source of all life, both manifest and unmanifest. So religion binds one to the source, namely, God. One who understands religion, is realising God. Verily, One who understands religion practically has understood God also. He is not in any way separate from God. He is eternally one with Him. Such a one will exclaim in the words of Christ, "I and my Father are one!"

"What is your religion?" is the question asked daily everywhere and by everyone. "To what denomination do you belong?" If I answer in India that I am a Christian, they will take me for a lunatic. If I say in America that I am a Hindu, then most of the church people will not fail to pity me, considering me a heathen. If I say to the Buddhists that I am not a follower of Buddha, they will think I am groping in darkness. A Muslim, seeing that I am not a follower of Islam, will call me a "Kaffir" or unbeliever. If I say to some other class of people that I believe in no religion, they will not fail to stamp me as an atheist. Thus, we see people everywhere clinging to their own particular creed and personality, crucifying the living Truth, the real religion. Unless they rise above all personalities and other beliefs, they will not give up saying,"Our religion alone is the best and all the rest are the worst."

I often become perplexed and confused when asked as to what denomination or religion I belong. In the first place, am I merely a heap of flesh to "belong" to a creed or religion? In Universal Love, how can I belong to any of these forms or names? Certain things belong to certain individuals. Am I a thing or article to belong to a church or temple? Ignorant man is satisfied by attending his church on Sundays and allowing his priest to pray for him. Religion troubles him no further. But the real religionist will never be happy until he dives deep into the fathomless depths of religion and thus becomes one with all, embracing the whole world.

Recently, when I was spending a Sunday in the woods of Chester County, away from Philadelphia, communing with the religion of natural life, to my astonishment and joy I met there a clergyman. He was kind enough to give me a leaflet advocating Christianity. Because of my brown skin and regarding me a heathen, he began to teach me the religion of Christianity. With all respect and glory to Lord Christ, let me say he began to teach me churchianity rather than Christianity.

If one really drinks deep of the nectar of true religion, he fails not to embrace it, whether one is a saint or a sinner, a Mohammedan or Buddhist! In fact the real religion of Christ is nothing but Universal Love! "Churchianity" is all differences and Christianity is all love. Hinduism is also nothing but Universal Love.

On the surface of the ocean there is strife and confusion, one wave succeeding another, each clashing in its own turn and resulting in foam and great splashes of water. But if you go deep to the bottom of the sea, there it is free from all kinds of waves and clashes. It is free from struggle of every kind. It is all peace and calmness there.

So whether a man is in this religion or that religion, he should not be satisfied with mere belief and blind attachment to forms and names, but should dive deep into his own religion until he tastes and realises the truth of Universal Love, which is the basis of all great religions. Thus alone will he be a blessing to his own religion and unto humanity.

No religion need boast of its superiority over another. Comparing of sects and creeds is nothing but ignorance. Each religion possesses its own sublime truths. If a man is true to his own religion, he can be true to all other religions; he will not find a black spot upon which to lay his hand, either in his own religion or in the religions of the world. It is said that one who can feel God within his own heart, can feel God in the hearts of all. The same is also the case with religion.

The fact is that in every religion and creed on the face of the earth, you will find a division of two kinds, namely, the essentials and non-essentials. The non-essentials will be different in each religion, whereas the essentials will be the same in all religions. So the men who cling to the outer creeds of religions fight and quarrel with each other, but those who have risen above outer forms, doctrines and beliefs, will not fail to find the same beauties expressed everywhere in the whole world of sects and creeds.

My message to sisters and brothers of all denominational religions is to hold on and cling to their respective religions until they can rise above the outer garbs or beliefs. By merging .deep into their own religion and rising above all doctrines, they will not fail to realise the inner beauties of the Universal Love within themselves. By living the right life and rising above all barriers and boundaries, one will be brought face to face with the religion universal, which is the goal of one's life.

Religion is one's own birthright. It is within alone! Without realising the Truth which is within, no amount of changing one religion for another will help anyone!

In coming to a definite conclusion of our present subject, I have only one more important item to deal with. Everywhere we find many people complaining about the lack of time to pray or realise God. Here, if we will only take a minute to examine for ourselves a few of the ideas just given in this present subject, we will not fail to arrive at the conclusion that the complaint of lack of time is nothing but ignorance and even meaningless.

It is nothing but ignorance which says, "I have no time for religion or God." When God is pervading and permeating in us from top to toe, how can people be deaf and blind to the glorious Truth filling their beings? The real danger, therefore, lies only in confining ourselves to the religion of outer forms separated from one's life. The beauty and salvation of individuals or creeds, lie only in their inseparable oneness with religion in life or death.

Then there are some more blind brothers and sisters whom we see daily in these days of outer civilization, who say, "Oh, we are happy without bothering our heads with religion." Perhaps they are content and happy in eating, sleeping and counting dollars, but how long can they remain happy with the finite toys of the world, disconnecting themselves from the living source of all strength and Peace? Happiness—where is it, what is it? How can one be happy eternally?

Suffice it to say, that real happiness can never be found in the finite things of names and forms. Time alone will make people grow, and experience alone will teach them to seek for real joy within themselves. The Son of God may come at any time, so we must be ever watchful, if not, the fate of many will be like the five foolish virgins in the parable of the bridegroom. Therefore, instead of wasting precious time in eating, drinking and playing, neglecting the aim of human birth, all should be ready for the bridegroom's coming, like the five wise virgins, ever keeping their oneness with the Almighty. Life is not worth living if it is not for this contact with true religion. It is not meant for contact with Mammon, however mighty or rich one may be.

When I was coming from India on the steamer *Benares*, I happened to converse with an English brother of mine. In the course of our talk, when I asked him whether he read the Holy Bible daily, he replied boldly that he had given up the practice of such bad things as reading the Bible or praying long ago! I felt shocked at this reply.

But still, he is a man of education, he is a man of culture and civilization in the eyes of the world and its outer life. It is a pity to find in the name of civilization many such souls who are engaged in doing "good"

things, such as smoking, drinking and other acts of lower life, forsaking and giving up, as our English brother said, "the bad things" of reading the Bible, attending church, etc. But like any of us, they too are from God though leading surface lives.

I have come to the conclusion that there are four kinds of people in the world:

- 1. Those who wickedly ignore the existence of God or the higher life because they are in the state of animals, ever deriving satisfaction from the contact of senses in their sensual lives.
- 2. Those who complain of lack of time for realising God. There is the seed of devotion in these souls—they need only to understand the Truth and their relationship with same and thus to strive further on and on.
- 3. Those who are satisfied with the outer forms of religion. These should rise from the non-essentials to the essentials of religion and thus strive to find the perennial spring of joy and Peace within themselves.
- 4. Those for whom religion is the be-all and end-all; those who are living inseparably as one—in the past, present and future, realising the Kingdom of Heaven within themselves.


If there are people who truly deserve the name "images of God" it is only such people belonging to the fourth class who are worthy. All honour and glory be unto them!

By self-examination and understanding, everyone should see for himself, if he is in the first, second, third or fourth state. 

I need not close my eyes and meditate to see God, for He comes to me in the form of my loving visitors. Everyone is a living image of God.



Its gates are standing now ajar,


