Speech delivered by Pujya Sri Padmanabhananda Swamiji on the occasion of 131st Birthday of Pujya Sri Swami Omkarji

We are celebrating the birthday of Worshipful Sri Omkar Swamiji, the birthday of one who has no birth. How do we celebrate the birthday of one who has no birth and what is the relevance and importance of such a day?

Paramatma is unborn, ever present, but still Krishna Bhagawan says, 'Yada Yadahi Dharmasya Glanir Bhavati Bharata, Abhyurthana madharmasyaTadatmanamSrujamyaham'. 'Wherever there is a decline in righteousness and an increase in sinfulness, I appear in this world.' Not only to protect and restore righteousness, but also sometimes God takes birth to accomplish specific tasks. Though He had taken several forms, out of them, only 10 are well known as Avataaras. Depending upon the specific task to be accomplished, he takes suitable form and after completing His mission, He leaves that body or form and exits from this world. To protect Vedas, he had taken the form of a fish. To protect Devas, at the time of churning of the ocean of milk, he came in the form of a turtle. He saved the mother earth, taking the form of Varaha, the wild boar. Pleased with Prahlada's devotion, He appeared as Narasimha, half man and half lion and ended religious persecution. Like this, God has appeared in many Avatars to fulfil different tasks and disappeared immediately after that. But during Rama Avatar and Krishna Avatar, the duration was much longer, and these are known as Poorna Avataara, full or complete Avatar.

Vedavyas is also considered as an Avatar. He compiled Vedas, written Mahbharata, and enriched spiritual knowledge through several writings. He had also written Puranas for the benefit of common man to understand easily.

Sri Adi Sankaracharya, considered as an Avatar of Lord Shiva, revived the dying Advaita Vedanta. Before his birth, many Darshan Sastras were coming into prominence and Advaita Vedanta was losing its relevance. Adi Shankara had uplifted the decaying Advaita philosophy. Once, when he goes for alms/begging, a woman offers him a gooseberry as she was extremely poor and did not have anything else to give him. Out of compassion, he prayed to Goddess Laxmi, the prayer/shlokas are popularly known as Kanaka Dhara Stotram. Pleased with his prayer, Goddess Lakshmi appears but tells him that the poor lady did not do any virtuous act to bless her with riches. Adi Shankara tells her of the act of charity- sacrificing the only gooseberry she had and then the poor lady was blessed with prosperity. Bhagavan Sri Adi Shankaracharya had written commentary on Brahma Sutras. His commentary or introduction to Brahmasutras is known as Adhyasa (false attribution)Bhashyam. It is said that this whole world is an illusory superimposition of Brahman. For example, when we walk with other Swamijis in dark amongst the trees, a rope may appear as a snake for someone. This is called Adhyasa, by Adi Shankara. Likewise, gold is seen in many forms in ornaments like bangles, chains, earrings, etcetera. But they are not different from gold. Only gold has taken different forms and names. Another example is when a picture of dog is sculpted on a rock, to look at it as a dog is Adhyasa, though it is not really a dog but only a stone.

Chandogya Upanishad says 'Vacharambhanam vikaro namadheyam', meaning all changes are mere words in names only. This concept of Adhyasa, avidya is not easily understood by ordinary people. To explain this philosophy in easy ways and to make it simple for a common man, God appears in the form of Saints and Mahatmas. Mahatmas like Bhagavan Ramana Maharshi, Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa, Sivananda ji Maharaj. Omkar Swamiji-all conveyed

such truths in simple, understandable ways. For any kind of question or doubt raised by people going to him, Sri Ramana Bhagavan always used to make only one statement: truth alone exists, nothing else. Sivanandaji Maharaj has expressed Vedanta philosophy in simple songs so that everyone can easily understand and sing. In this way, God appears in the form of Mahatmas only to help people understand the spiritual truths through their simple and effective writings and their lives.

The peace prayer written by Omkar Swamiji has received world fame as a world peace prayer. It begins with 'Adorable Presence'. Swamiji describes God as not only existence but adorable existence or presence. This word, Presence itself explains that all that exists is God alone. The peace prayer brings out God's omnipresent nature in simple words, unlike complex expressions used in various Upanishads, though he has taken the main content from them.

Swamiji further elaborates God's presence in plain words as:

'Thou who art within and without, above and below, and all around, thou who art interpenetrating the very cells of our being'.

Mundak Upanishad in sloka 2.2.11 gives a similar description: "Brahmaivedamantram, purastad brahma paschad Brahma dakshinata, schottarenaadharschordhvam cha prasratam brahma ivedam viswamidam varishtam."

That immortal Brahman alone is behind, that Brahman is to the right and left, pervades everything, above and below, this universe is that Brahman alone.

Kena Upanishad (1.2): "shrotrasya shrotram manaso mano yadvacho ha vacham sa u pranasya pranaschakshusashchaksuh....."

The ear of the ear, the mind of the mind, the tongue of the tongue, and also the life of the life and the eye of the eye....

Swamiji has written it in the Peace Prayer as: thou who art the Eye of our eyes, the Ear of our ears, the Heart of our hearts, the Mind of our minds, the Breath of our breaths, the Life of our lives and the Soul of our souls....'

If anyone asks, when and where should one seek God, Swamiji has a beautiful answer- Now and Here! He says 'bless us dear God, to be aware of Thy Presence, Now and Here.

Swamiji addresses God as Sat, Chit Ananda Swaroopa, truth-consciousness-bliss. Truth is not separate or different from consciousness and they are also not different from bliss. Truth is consciousness, consciousness is bliss and bliss is truth. This is Brahman.

Further, he writes, 'May peace and goodwill abide among individuals as well as communities and nations. This is our earnest prayer.' He concludes the prayer with, 'May peace be unto all'. Om Peace Peace Peace. This earnest prayer is for the peace of all and not for any particular person, community or nation. He brought out the essence of the Vedic santi mantras like 'Sam no astudwipade, Sam chatushpade.... In simple words!

Let us strive to realise Satchidananda Swaroop, truth-consciousness-bliss, all-pervasive Paramatma, indwelling Light now and here! Through this, let us all make Omkar Swamiji happy.

May his grace and blessings be on all of us!

Most revered Omkar Swamiji was like a clear sky. Anyone, however distracted or disturbed he may be, felt peaceful, focussed and pure in his company. It was because Swamiji had a pure and steady state of mind. His presence itself quietened others' wavering minds. Just like when we go near fire, we feel hot and when a pleasant breeze blows, we feel cool, in the same way, when we are in the company of great souls, we experience a calm and peaceful mind. The sky does not get affected by the heat of the sun, the rain or the cold. So also, Swamiji is pure at heart and unaffected by external factors. He was such a great soul that he taught Atmajnanam, the knowledge of Self, to anyone whoever approached him and without any expectation.

Even parents may have some expectation or the other while bringing up their children. Only self-realised persons can take up activities without expecting anything in return.

The whispering sound that comes from the waves near a sea is Omkar. The chirping sounds of birds is also Omkar. The soft muffled crackling sound that comes out of leaves is nothing but Omkar. All sounds are Omkar only. There is nothing but Omkar.

God had proclaimed, 'Nahi jnanena sadrusam' (Bhagawad Gita 4,38), nothing is comparable to knowledge. There is nothing like knowledge in the past, present or future. Many saints have also conveyed in different ways, that there is nothing superior to knowledge. In day to day life, when someone is successful in business, achieves praiseworthy status in any field, we all would like to follow their methods and approaches to success. But in spiritual life, why we are not eager to adopt the methods and practices of saints and seek that spiritual knowledge?

Once a sanyasi came to the Ashram, the following was the conversation between Swami Omkarji and the Sanyasi.

Sanyasi: Ashram is quite spacious. I would like to spend some time here.

Swamiji: What is your profession?

Sanyasi: I keep visiting religious places. I have no other profession.

Swamiji: How is it possible not to have any profession? You must have some work, isn't it like regular spiritual practices, meditation, reciting God's name or self-study? What do you know?

Sanyasi: I don't know anything. I have an Akshaya Patra (a begging bowl).

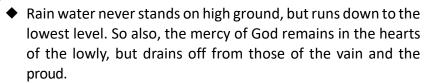
Swamiji: Is this only your profession? Very good. Get ready in the morning after completing your morning routine. Continue your

profession. There are many people in the nearby villages who are suffering from hunger. They all need to be fed well and freed from hunger. Otherwise, how can they understand spiritual teachings?

The Sanyasi left the Ashram the very next day.

Some people ask: 'is there hot water supply in Santi Ashram?' When Omkar Swamiji came to this place, there wasn't even water here. It is only because of his efforts and sadhana that we have water in this area today. What kind of devotion is it if you are enquiring about mosquitoes, hot water etc.?

Swamiji was above body consciousness. May we all, with his blessings, aspire for such a state.

If only we can understand and obey his instructions and follow his advice, we can also have peace and joy in our lives.

It is sad to see that the world is filled with slaves of food, fashion and passion instead of with masters of Nature in every aspect. Such slavery brings bondage, creates weakness and kills self-reliance.

I put only a small chilly into it for taste."

I heard people that eat only a single coconut a day and thus prolong their lives and look young always. I once met a great soul, who is the picture of health and happiness, in spite of his many long years and I asked him to tell me the secret of his perpetual youth and he smilingly replied, "I live attuning myself with nature, eating natural food, enjoying out-door life, observing celibacy ever filled with pure and clean thoughts.

Here is a personal question to my loving readers. Are you eating to live or living only to eat? Pause for a while and answer the question yourselves sincerely. Wake up from the surface of artificiality to the glorious life of Nature and thus eat only something natural and invigorating, to help you to realise the goal of your precious lives.

What prevents us in comparing some stomachs to garbage pails? Alas, they are not even, private or personal garbage pails but they

are the public ones, for such stomachs are continuously, from various sources filled with every kind of highly spiced pungent, putrefied food of many mixtures. Eating and drinking is not only the goal but the soul of such lives. Watch them while they eat. Are they eating food, chewing and masticating? No, no, they are gulping, swallowing it hastily and bolting it. They have a very long way to walk before they return to nature. The root cause of all worry, hurry, sickness, weakness and ignorance of every kind is only the unnatural way of eating unnatural things.

Now let us consider the dress we wear. Are we wearing it only to protect our bodies from the heat and cold? No, no, the times are changed and so are the lives. Whether we are monks or householders, we have to wear a certain dress conforming to the rules of the order, being slaves of fashion, all this has changed.

Even in the mental plane we do not have any freedom. We are made to think sometimes as others think. In the spiritual world also, there is very little freedom. Many are like blind sheep following their headless shepherd whether it is for good or bad. Thus, at every step, we are violating the natural laws of life choking the instinct, burying the free-will and blindly ignoring HIS OMNIPRESENCE.

We are always on the go, filled with mental strain, running after innumerable conflicting desires. Where are peace, poise and contentment? How badly we all need relaxation. Watch the faces of people as they walk by, sit or eat. They are in a terrible hurry as if they were spirits in the nether world.

Did you ever see passengers sitting in the railway trains as if glued to the seats, clutching their fists? Many people also do carry their luggage in the compartment where they sit. They carry it on their shoulders, and thus make their lives nervous wrecks.

It was only last year; we were ascending the steep hills of Kashmir in a lorry which was fully loaded with luggage. We were on a level of more than ten thousand feet and the path was narrow and curves steep and dangerous. No doubt, the least slip would have meant an 'Adieu' to this world, but there was no need to cross such bridges before we reached them. You have only to glance at the death-like paleness on the faces of some of the worried passengers, to see that they were already in the hands of death passing untold agonies and sufferings. They were embracing death not once but several times before the lorry reached its destination over those slippery and rugged roads. It has been said that one is dying every time he is afraid of some little thing or other.

We all need relaxation, not only on the smooth roads of life, but even in climbing the rugged precipices. Not only in the waking hours but even in sleeping time. We find very few people who can repose peacefully, relaxing their feverish nerves and restless minds. Relaxation is the spiritual food for the body, mind and the soul. It is quite essential in all vocations of life.

A preacher should preach his sermon in a most relaxed and natural way but never should he teach excitedly, pretending to be something other than what he is. All excitement and restlessness come only from a life of pretention. Even when we have company, instead of being simple, humble and natural, we pretend to be something other than what we are; no need of putting an unnatural air of false pride and supremacy, killing the God-given, blessed state of relaxation and reposeful serenity. Whatever we may be doing, it is our privilege to be relaxed. It costs us so little to be relaxed and it means so much for the success of life. It has been experienced by one's self analysis by scientists, that one hour sleep in a totally relaxed state is equal to the dreamy and restless sleep of twenty-four hours.

There is no need of strangulating the presence of God by practising some of the painful postures, where one is stiff, nervous and excited. Meditation should be practised in an easy and comfortable posture, with perfect relaxation. Relaxation is the soul and goal of all spiritual practices and meditation. Once a disciple approached a Guru- the spiritual teacher and asked him to initiate him into the mysteries of life. He received the direct and simple initiation in the form of the following words: -

"BE YOUR OWN SWEET SELF, ALWAYS"

If we could only remain for ever, as our own Sweet Self, what else is needed. Poor and naked we came and we return in the same way from this world. There is nothing to be added or accumulated, neither is there anything left out or renounced for those who are living as the One Sweet Self, for it is complete in itself.

To return to nature, one must enter into the heart of nature, spending a part of the time in the lap of nature among trees, where birds sing hymns of joy, flowers perfume and bloom, fresh winds blow and rocks stand in silent grandeur. MOTHER GANGA

SWAMI SIVANANDA

The Ganga is the most sacred river of India. Lord Krishna says in the Gita: "I am the Ganga among rivers." No germ can flourish in the waters of the Ganga. It is saturated with antiseptic minerals. In the West, doctors prescribe Ganga water for rubbing in the treatment of diseases of the skin. Ganga is not merely a river. It is a sacred Tirtha. It is possessed of mysterious powers which are not found in any other rivers in the world. Even scientists admitted the efficacy of the Ganga water.

Dr. F.C. Harrison of McGill University, Canada, writes: "A peculiar fact, which has never been satisfactorily explained, is the guick death (in three or five hours) of the cholera vibrio in the waters of Ganga. When one remembers sewage, by numerous corpses of natives (often dead of cholera) and by the bathing of thousands of natives, it seems remarkable that the belief of Hindus, that the water of this river is pure and cannot be defiled and that they can safely drink it and bathe in it, should be confirmed by modern bacteriological research." A well-known French physician Dr. D. Herelle, made similar investigations into the mystery of the Ganga. He observed some of the floating corpses of men dead of dysentery and cholera and was surprised to find that only a few feet below the bodies, where one would expect to find millions of these dysentery and cholera germs, there were no germs at all. He then grew germs from patients having the disease and to these cultures added water from the Ganga. When he incubated the mixture for a period, much to his surprise, the germs were completely destroyed.

A British physician Dr. C.E. Nelson, F.R.C.S. tells us of another striking fact. He says: "Ships leaving Calcutta for England take their water from the Hugli River which is one of the mouths of the filthy Ganga and this Ganga water will remain fresh all the way to England. On the other hand, ships leaving England for India, find that the water that they take on in London will not stay fresh till they reach Bombay, the nearest Indian Port, which is a week closer to England than Calcutta. They must replenish their water supply at Fort Said, Suez or at Adden on the Red Sea. It is no wonder that the Indian people should hold that the Ganga is very sacred and possessed of mysterious powers."

For a Hindu the word 'Ganga' has its own sacred association. Every Hindu thirsts for a dip in the Ganga, and for a drop of water at the time of his death. Aspirants and mendicants build their huts on the banks of the Ganga for practising penance and meditation. Bhishma spoke very highly on the glory of the Ganga in his parting instructions to the Pandavas from his bed of arrows.

Wherever a pious Hindu goes to take his bath, he invokes first the Ganga, and feels Her presence in the water before he takes a plunge in the river. If he lives in a place far away from the Ganga, he intensely yearns to see Her on some day and feels blessed by bathing in the holy waters. He carries some water to his house and carefully saves it in a vessel so that he may use it for purposes of purification.

Hindus believe that all their sins are washed away if they take a dip in the sacred waters of the Ganga.

In the Satya Yuga, all places were sacred. In the Treta Yuga, Pushkara was considered as the most holy place. In the Dvapara Yuga, Kurukshetra was regarded as the most sacred place. In Kali Yuga, the Ganga has that glory. Devi Bhagavata says: "He who utters

the name of Ganga even from hundreds of miles afar, is freed from sins and attains the abode of Lord Hari."

The Ganga comes out of the Supreme Being. She enters the feet of Sri Hari and reaches Vaikuntha. She issues from Goloka and passes through the regions of Vishnu, Brahma, Siva, Dhruva, Chandra, Surya, Tapah, Janah, Mahah, and reaching Indraloka flows as Mandakini.

The Ganga entered the matted locks of Lord Siva at the request of Bhagiratha who did rigorous penance for the descent of Ganga to Patala for the redemption of his ancestors, the thousand sons of Sagara, who had been burnt to ashes by sage Kapila.

Thereupon, She flowed down from the locks of Lord Siva. She was drunk up by the sage Jahnu, as the water inundated the Yajnasala of the sage. Then again, She issued out of the ear of the sage and acquired the name of Jahnavi. She is also known by the name Bhagirathi, daughter of Bhagiratha. The Ganga flowed into Patala as Bhagirathi. The ancestors of the king were raised to Svarga by the touch of the sacred waters of the Ganga.

Ganga had to take a human form on account of Her own fault in behaviour in the presence of Brahma. She became the wife of Santanu. Santanu also was a celestial being known as king of Mahabhisha. He had to take birth in the world for his fault in conduct in the presence of Brahma by showing vanity. Ganga gave birth to Bhishma, the illustrious hero and sage.

Ganga consented to bear the seed of Lord Siva which was transferred to Her by Agni. She gave to the world, Lord Subrahmanya, the great commander of the army of Devas, who killed the formidable Asura Taraka.

Ganga is the form of Vishnu. Her sight is soul stirring and elevating. She flows in the valleys and lives by the side of Parvati, daughter of Himavan. How magnificent She is when She flows in the valley of Rishikesh! She has a blue colour like that of the ocean. The water is extremely clear and sweet. Rich people from the plains get water from Rishikesh. They take it in big copper vessels to far off places in India.

To have a look at the Ganga in Rishikesh, is soul-elevating. To sit for a few minutes on a block of stone by the side of the Ganga, is a blessing. To stay for some months in Rishikesh on the bank of the Ganga and do Anushthana or Purascharana, is great Tapas which will take the aspirant to the abode of Lord Hari. To live for ever on the banks of the Ganga and spend the life in meditation is Sivanandam.

May Mother Ganga bless you all! May She help you to live on Her banks and practise Yoga and Tapas!

THE EFFICACY OF THE PRAYER

Man is in essence a spark of the divine power. But he manifests himself in lower worlds. His physical body is like an animal. His mind makes him human and his spirit which is the spark of God makes him divine. The summumbonum of human existence is to seek the kingdom of Heaven within. Man is essentially a spiritual being, his self being an emanation from the Universal Self, God. Hence to know himself, his deepest self, is to know God. He can sink in consciousness into the depths of his own being beyond the body, the passions, the emotions, the mind and the reason; these all his, but they are not he, he can pass beyond them all, and realise himself as separate from them, the pure 'I'. Then the recognition dawns that the universal spirit into which the Self opens, transcends all the beings in which it is manifested and is alike in all.

The paths leading to this self-realisation are many. One of the paths is through prayer. It is of threefold forms: - physical, verbal and mental. The first consists of rituals and ceremonials. In modern life due to stress of activity, lack of leisure and other conveniences, this form of prayer has almost fallen out of use in the life of the individual. In view of this tendency of the age, great emphasis was laid on verbal and mental prayer which is meditation and meditation is sequential thinking directed towards an inspiring and interesting object- an Ista devatha, no matter what the deity is. As Sri. Rajagopalachari said, it is true that Bhakti counted, and it did not matter what deity we worship.

In all our puranas great emphasis is laid on verbal prayer because it is easier to practise than the other two. "The seeker after Truth"

says Manu, "reaches the highest goal by japa only. And "japa" declares the Mahabharata, "is said to be the best of all spiritual practices" in the modern age. The Vishnu purana supports this view whole-heartedly when it observes, "That which one obtained through meditation in the Satya Yuga (the Golden Age), through sacrifice in the Treta Yuga (Silver Age) and through worship in the Dwapara Yuga (Bronze Age), may be achieved in the Kali Yuga (Iron Age) by reciting the names of the Lord.

In the modern age, the physical body and the mind of man are highly developed. The divinity in man is dormant. As has already been stated man has a mind but mind is not man. But the tragedy of the present day is that man thinks that he is the mind. Mind is a good servant but a bad master. We are living in an age of the mind, of intellect which is trying to assert its supremacy over man. Look at the incalculable harm the mind has done in releasing the forces of nature- atomic energy, for the destruction of man himself. Can there be anything more suicidal than this?

The reason is not far to seek. The gulf between the human mind and the divinity within him has not been spanned. The mind is estranged from the divinity latent in man. How to link the mind of man with his divinity? Prayer is the bridge that connects the human with the divine. This prayer has to be practised daily, hourly and in fact every moment of our waking consciousness in order to strengthen it. When the diabolic pleasure of the human mind in releasing destructive forces can be sublimated, the angelic influences send forth comfort and peace, happiness and health to all mankind.

A suffering world is calling to us. Within us is the power to heal waiting to be discovered and released through prayer. Shall we then not find time to pray and to turn towards and seek the God within,

that we may reveal Him to others and that the spiritual life may become a living reality to us and to them? As Rajaji had said recently that the quality of love, kindness and mercy are the attributes of God. If we imbibe and manifest these qualities in our daily life, we could say that we have truly offered prayers to God. In fact, as Swami Vivekananda has said, 'Every soul is potentially divine. The goal is to manifest the divinity within, by controlling nature, external and internal. Do this either by work, prayer or worship or psychic control or all of these- and be free. This is the whole of religion." Thus, prayer leads to the kingdom of Heaven within us and let us begin it now.

The path of self-surrender declared in the sublime teachings of the Gita is the easiest one, and this fact is borne witness to by the galaxy of sages and saints, both of the past and the present ages. Krishna, Mohammed, Buddha and Jesus Christ-founders of the four great religions of the world- perfectly agree in that they point to this path alone as the supreme way to the attainment of God, i.e. immortality and peace.

Thus forgiveness and mercy are held forth as the great attributes, essentially to be cultivated by the earnest seeker according to the teachings of all incarnations, saints and sages of the world.

It is better for him, thinks the aspirant to die in the practice of forgiveness rather than live through revenge, because while one elevates him to the immortal status, the other drags him further deep into the hell of ever-recurring births and deaths. Understanding the Unreality of Matter Sri Sri Paramahansa Yogananda

The Hindu scriptures point out that belief in the nonexistence of matter and the allness of Spirit should not be founded on dogmatic, illogical, unintelligible, or inexplicable theories, but on scientific inner investigation and exact understanding.

People generally identify themselves with the body, which is supported by food; but they fail to realize that the basic source of bodily existence is prana (life energy). No food or other outer aid can revive a man from whom the cosmic current has withdrawn. The link between man's material body and his immaterial mind is prana. The ancient Hindu sages discovered the existence of prana and formulated the science of pranayama, life-energy control.

Lord Jesus fasted in the wilderness for forty days. He said: "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." The 'word' is cosmic vibration; the "mouth of God" is the medulla oblongata in the posterior part of the brain, tapering of into the spinal cord. This, the most vital spot in the human body, is the divine entrance ("mouth of God") for the "word" or "Aum", the cosmic vibratory energy by which man is sustained.

People who never fast do not know from experience that man can live solely by the "word" of God. In the early stages of a week's fasting, hunger is present; but as the days go by, less hunger and a sense of freedom are distinctly felt. Why? Because denial of gross food to the body compels it to depend on immaterial food: the life current.

Man's will power is the great generator of energy. Through will power and willingness one is able to draw quickly on the infinite store of inner strength. A person who is unwilling to perform his daily tasks experiences a lack of energy. A man who works hard but with willingness is borne up physically and mentally by the cosmic current.

One who learns and practices the metaphysical methods of living by will power and by consciously tapping the inexhaustible source of life energy is freed from many limitations of the body. The Hindu sages and yogis say that matter is materialised mind-stuff; and some of them have proved this truth by demonstrating the power to materialize and dematerialize their bodies and other physical objects.

The Chemical Elements of Matter are Electronic Vibrations:

Modern science shows that matter is composed of vibratory forces. The chemical elements, the structural factors are responsible for all forms in the universe- from stones and stars to man- are nothing more than different forms of electronic vibrations. For example, in ice we find coldness, weight, form; it is visible. Melt the ice; it becomes water. Pass electricity through it, it becomes invisible hydrogen and oxygen, which analysed further, are forms of electronic vibrations. One may therefore say scientifically that ice does not exist, even though it is perceptible to our senses of sight, touch, and so on. In reality its essence is invisible electrons or forms of energy. In other words, that which can be dissolved into invisibility cannot be said to have valid existence. In this sense, matter can be considered as not existing, but matter does have relative existence. Matter exists in relation to our mind and as an expression of invisible electronic forces that do exist, being unchangeable and immortal.

Both water and ice are manifestations of invisible gases and have only formal transitory existence. Similarly, both mortal mind and matter are fleeting manifestations of Divine Consciousness, and possess merely formal existence; in reality only, cosmic mind exists.

Just as a child is born through the instrumentality of parents, so matter is dependent on mind for its existence. Matter is born from Divine Mind and is perceptible to mortal mind; in itself and of itself, matter has no reality, no intrinsic existence.

The blind or non-intellectual electronic forces of creation are nevertheless creative teleological agents because they contain within themselves the vibrations of the universal, conscious-of-itself life force or prana, which in turn issued from the fiat of Divinity.

"God said, let there be light; and there was light," that is, the projection of Divine Thought and Will became light or vibratory energy; the flowing forth of life current and electrons, which further vibrated more strongly and became the diverse subtle or unseen forces of nature, which in turn externalised themselves as the ninety-two principal elements of matter that constitute the universe.

To human consciousness, matter is both perceptible and real. But man has discovered through theoretical investigation, through logic, and through certain laboratory experiments (such as converting a visible piece of ice into invisible forces) that a permanent and unalterable creative power must underlie all the transitory and illusive forms of the phenomenal world.

This truth may be grasped just as we grasp the fact that the ocean exists though its waves have no permanent existence, being just passing, formal manifestations of one great substance. Waves cannot exist without the ocean, but the ocean exists with or without waves.

These concepts can be intellectually understood but cannot be known until one has learned the method of converting matter into life force, and life force into Cosmic Consciousness, as Krishna, Christ, and other Self-realized masters were able to do. To such an enlightened one, matter per se does not exist, because they see that beneath the slight rippling waves of creation is the changeless Ocean of Spirit.

The Universe is God's Dream:

In the Vedanta, and Yoga philosophies the universe is spoken of as God's dream. Matter and mind- the cosmos with its stars and planets; the gross surface waves and the subtle undercurrents of the material creation; the human powers of feeling, will, and consciousness; and the states of life and death, day and night, health and disease, success and failure- are realities according to the law of relativity governing this dream of God's.

All the dualities perceived by the law of relativity are real to the dreamer, the mortal man who plays his little part in the great cosmic dream. To escape from maya, illusion, the law of relativity, one must awaken from the dream into eternal God-wakefulness. We cannot change the lawful dream by imagination or by denying its existence, or by accepting "life" but rejecting "death", or by recognising health but ignoring sickness. One state is as much a part of its opposite state as are the two sides of a fabric. The dualities are inherently and essentially one. The truth seeker does not try to separate them in his mind, but to rise above them by wisdom.

The man who considers his body to be different from his mind, and who wants to accept as "real" only the positive, happy, and beneficial aspects of a universe unalterably dual in its nature, is a man deeply asleep in the delusions of the dream world.

Just as a person has dreams that seem real for a time but lose their validity when he emerges into the waking state of consciousness, so it is possible for man to awaken from the dream of matter-reality and to live in the changeless realm of Spirit.

Only the superman, who has learned to expand and transfer his consciousness to the Infinite, can realize creation as a dream of God's; he alone can say with true knowledge that matter has no existence. By means of a long series of self-disciplinary stepsthrough following the scientific yoga path or any other way of spiritual perfection, whether that of love, wisdom, service, or self-effacement- God-seeker dissolves the dualities and discerns the Eternal Oneness. "He who, freed from delusion, knows Me as the Supreme Spirit obtains omniscience. He worships Me with his whole being."
